**T**HE Squadrons of Naples and Turis, making together 15 Gallies, passed before this Port the 25th Instant, being come from the Coast of Naples with about 800 Soldiers on board, whom they landed at Final, from whence they are to march to Milan; after which 13 of the said Gallies failed towards the Straights Meviti.

**Venice, June 3.** The Cardinal *d'Estrees* returned hither the 28th past from the Courts of *Modena* and *Parma*, being but ill satisfied with the Success of his Negotiation there. The Imperial Ambassador is also come back from *Roveredo*, where he has been to confer with Prince *Eugene of Savoy*, and had Audience of the Senate the 30th. The Prince of *Darmstadt* arrived here the 28th from *Catalonia*, and continued his Journey to *Vienna* the next day. Letters from *Verona* give an Account, that 4000 Imperial Horse were entered in the Territory of *Vicenza*, and had pitched themselves in the Plains of *Colagna*, *Montaguana*, and *Lonigo*, where they expected a small Body of Foot, with a design to proceed together towards *Legnano*, and that the French had made a detachment of 4000 Horse who were marching on the other side of the *Adige* to observe the Forces commanded by General *Palfi*. Prince *Eugene of Savoy* was advanced with 16000 Germans and 12 Field-pieces to the Valley of *Polifella*, and was followed by the Artillery and Baggage. 'Tis said, the Imperial Army will in few days be above 30000 strong, and will march towards *Ferrara* and *Medena*.

**Vienna, June 1.** The Letters from Prince *Eugene of Savoy* of the 26th past give an Account, that finding the French had possessed themselves of the Passes on the side of *Rivole*, the Imperial Forces had turned their March towards the Country of *Vicenza*; and that Count *Palfi* was ordered to march before with 4000 Horse and Dragoons to a Place called *Legnano*, to secure the Bridge that is there over the *Adige*, or (if that could not be effected) to make a Bridge of Boats in order to the Army's passing that River. The Regiments of Horse of *Newburgh* and *Darmstadt* arrived at *Linz* the 30th past, and continued their March the next day to join the Imperial Army in *Italy*. A great quantity of Corn, and other Provisions, was sent from hence this week for the Service of the Imperial Troops in that Country. The Imperial Court came the 28th past to the Palace at *Favorita*, and will return to-morrow to *Luxemburg*. Count *Solary*, who was sent to *Hungary* to seize Prince *Ragozzi*. Count *Sirmey*, and divers other Persons accused of being concerned in the late Plot, and to take Informations concerning this Conspiracy, is returned hither, and went yesterday to *Favorita*, to give the Emperor an Account of his Proceedings; and Count *Ottino*, with the other Commissioners appointed to try these Prisoners, will shortly be going to *Newstadt*, where they are kept under a very close Confinement, no body being admitted to speak with them. An Express arrived here this week from *Poland*, upon which the Emperor's Council have met several times, 'tis said he has brought an Answer to the Letter which the Emperor lately sent to the King of *Poland* to press him to an Accommodation with *Sweden*, and that the King of *Poland* expresses a willingness to enter into a Treaty for that purpose, provided the

Czar be included therein. Letters from *Adria-nople* of the 30th of *April* give an Account, that the Grand Signior arrived there the 10th from *Constantinople*, and that the Grand Visier was shortly expected. An Envoy was on his way thither from *Moscow*, with the Ratifications of the Treaty of Peace concluded between the Czar and the Port. They had received an Account from *Bagdad*, that the Persians refusing to yield to the Turks the Town of *Bassora*, the Bassaw of *Bagdad* drew together a considerable Body of Forces to oblige them to it, upon whose approach the Persians complied, and the Bassaw having taken Possession of the Place, was marched against the *Arabs*, who are in Rebellion against the Grand Signior.

**Frankfort, June 8.** The Deputies of several Princes and Towns of the *Upper Rhine* are come hither to assist at a Diet of this Circle, which is to meet in a day or two. New Levies are making in the Palatinate for the Elector Palatine's Service. They write from *Alsace*, that the French continue to fill their Magazines at *Landau*, and other Places on that Frontier, with Provisions and Ammunition, and that they talk of forming two Camps in a short time, the one between *Hemingen* and *New Brisac*, and the other near *Landau*.

**Cologne, June 10.** The Elector of *Cologne* returned the 8th Instant to *Ben* from viewing the Towns of *Zons*, *Rhyneberg*, and *Kyfferswaert*. The Levies for his Service are continued with great diligence, and Horses are bought up for his new-raised Troops. The Count of *Nassau Weilburg* is returned to *Duffeldorp* from the *Hague*, where he has been to negotiate several Matters with the States, in relation to the Forces which the Elector Palatine will send to their Assistance; His Electoral Highness has resolved to divide every Regiment of Horse and Foot in his Service into two Parts, each of which is to be made up by new Levies to a complete Regiment, and Men are raising for this purpose with all possible expedition; And that Horses may not be wanting for the Cavalry, the Elector has strictly forbid their being sent out of the Countries of *Burg* and *Julliers*; and more effectually to prevent the same, all the Inhabitants are obliged to bring their Horses to the next Magistrates, who are to take an Account of their Numbers, and put a certain Mark upon them. 'Tis said, that a Camp of about 25000 Men of the Forces of the King of *Prussia*, the Elector Palatine, and other Princes, will be formed in a short time near *Nays*.

**Hamburg, June 10.** Mr. *Cresset*, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, went from hence this day to the Court of *C.H.* The Duke of *Holstein Gottorp* is gone from hence to *Rhynebeck*, and intends, after a short stay there, to go and take a Review of the Swedish Forces in *Pommern*. Letters from *Norwiche* of the 2d Instant say, about 50 Transport Ships were sailed from thence with 1700 Swedish Horse and 600 Foot for *Revel*, and that there were more Forces ready to embark in that Port to be likewise transported to *Livonia*.
