HE Squadrons of Naples and Turfis, making together 15 Gallies, passed before this Port the 25th Instant, being come from the Coast of Naples with about 800 Scidiers on board, whom they landed at Final, from whence they are to march to Mian; after which 13 of the faid Gallies failed towards the Min; atter which 13 of the tate Country of the Cardinal d'Effrees returned hither water, June 3. The Imperial Ambassador is also come back from Romeds, where he has been to confer with Prince Eugene and had Audience of the Senate the 30th. Letters from Verona give an Account, that 4000 Imperial Hafe were entred in the Territory of Vienza, and had polled membeives in the Plains of Cologna, Montaguana, and Lunge, where they expected a finall Body of Foor, with a design to proceed together towards Legnano, and that the French had made a detachment of 4000 Horse who were marching on the other fide of the Adigs to observe the Forces commarded by General Palfa. Prince Eugen of Savoy was advanced with 16000 Germans and 12 Seld-pieces to the Valley of Polifella, and was tol-

ti field-pieces to the Valley of Polifella, and was tollowed by the Attillery and Biggge. Tis faid, the Imperial Army will in few days be above 30000 ftrong, and will much towards Ferrara and Medena.

Vienna, June 1. The Letters from Prince

Eigene of Savoy of the 26th past give an Account, that sinding the Franch had possessed themselves of the Passes on the side of Rivole, the Imperial Forces had turned their March towards the Country of Vicenze; and that Count Paif was ordered to march before with 4000 Horse and Dragoons to a Place called Legnano, to secure the Bridge that is there over the Adige, or (if that could not be effected) to make a Bridge of Boats in order to the Army's passing that River. The Regiments of Horse of Newburgh and Darmstad arrived at Lintz the 30th past, and continued their March the next day to join the Imperial Army in Italy. A great quantity of Corn, and other Provisions, was fent from hence this week for the Service of the Imperial Troops in that Country. The Imperial Court came the 28th past to the Palace at Favorita, and will return to morrow to Laxenburgh. Count Solary, who was fent to Hugary to seize Prince Ragozzi. Count Sirmey, and divers other Persons accused of being conterned in the late Plot, and to take Informations concerning this Conspiracy, is returned hither, and went yesterday to Favorita, to give the Emperor an Account of his Proceedings; and Count Otting, with the other Commissioners appointed to try these Prisoners, will shortly be going to Newsfad, where they are kept under a very close Consinement, no body being admitted to speak with them. An Express arrived here this west from prisoners and the constant of the Emperor's wek from Poland, upon which the Emperor's Council have met several times, 'tis said he has brought an Answer to the Letter which the Em-Peter lately fent to the King of Peland to press him to an Accommodation with Sweden, and that

Czar be included therein. Letters from Adriamople of the 30th of April give an Account, that the Grand Signior arrived there the 10th from Confantinople, and that the Grand Visier was shortly expected. An Envoy was on his way thither from Moform, with the Ratifications of the Treaty of Peace concluded between the Czar and the Port. They had received an Account from Bagdad, that the Persians resuling to yield to the Turks the Town of Baffora, the Baffaw of Bagdad drew together 2 considerable Body of Forces to oblige them to it, upon whose approach the Persians complied, and the Baslaw having taken Possession of the Place, was marched against the Arabs, who are in Rebel-

lion against the Grand Signior.

Francfort, June 8. The Deputies of several Princes and Towns of the Upper Rhine are come hither to affist at a Diet of this Circle, which is to meet in a day or two. New Levies are making in the Palatinate for the Elector Palatine's Service. They write from Alface, that the French continue to fill their Magazines at Landau, and other Places on that Frontier, with Provisions and Ammunition, and that they talk of forming two Camps in a short time, the one between Heuningen and New

Brifac, and the other near Landan.

Cologne, June to. The Elector of Cologne re-turned the 8th Instant to Ben from viewing the Towns of Zons, Rhynberg, and Kryferswaert. The Levies for his Service are continued with great diligence, and Horses are bought up for his new-raised Troops. The Count of Nassaw Weilburg's is returned to Duff ldorp from the Hague, where he has been to Negociate several Matters with the States, in relation to the Forces which the Elector Palatine will fend to their Assistance; His Electoral Highness has resolved to divide every Regiment of Horse and Foot in his Service into two Parts, each of which is to be made up by new Levies to a compleat Regiment, and Men are railing for this purpole with all pollible expedition; And that Horses may not be wanting for the Cavalry, the Elector has strictly forbid their being fent out of the Countries of Borg and Juliers; and more effectually to prevent the same. all the Inhabitants are obliged to being their Horses to the next Magistrates, who are to take an Account of their Numbers, and put a certain Mark upon them. 'Tis faid, that a Camp of about 25000 Men of the Forces of the King of Pruffia, the Elector Palatine, and other Princes, will be formed in a fhort time near Nuys.

Hamburgh, June 10. Mr. Croffet, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of Great-Britain, went from hence this day to the Court of C.R. The Duke of Holftein Gotterp is gone from hence to Rhynbeck, and intends, after a short stay there, to go and take a Review of the swedish Forces in Pomeren. Letters from Norceping of the 2d Instant say, about 50 Transport Ships were failed from thence with 1700 Swedish Horse and 600 Feor for Revel, and that there were more Forces ready to embatk in that Port to be likewise transported
