## PUBLIC WORKS LOANS.

Further Regulations, dated June 12, 1945, made by the Public Works Loan Commissioners, and approved by the Treasury pursuant to section 41 of the Public Works Loans Act, 1875 (38 & 39 Vict. c. 89).

1. The Secretary or Assistant Secretary to the Public Works Loan Commissioners (hereinafter re-ferred to as "the Loan Commissioners") shall from time to time certify to the National Debt Commis-sioners the amount required by the Loan Commis-sioners for the purposes of advances to be made under Section 9 of the Public Works Loans Act r875 and the date on which such advances are to be made. be made.

2. There shall be established a Public Works Loans 2. There shall be established a Public Works Loans (Advances) Account at the Bank of England under the control of the Loan Commissioners. Upon re-ceipt of any such certificate as aforesaid the National Debt Commissioners shall, on or before the day upon which the advances are due to be made, pay from the Local Loans Fund to the said Public Works Loans (Advances) Account the sum gracified in that cartific (Advances) Account the sum specified in that certifi-cate. Provided that the sum so paid together with amounts previously issued from the Local Loans Fund for the purpose of loans by the Loan Com-missioners shall not at any time in the aggregate exceed the amount authorised by Parliament to be so issued so issued.

3. Subject to the provisions of Regulations I and z being complied with as respects any such certificate as aforesaid the Secretary or Assistant Secretary to the Loan Commissioners, shall sign orders to the Cashiers of the Bank of England for payment out of the said Public Works Loans (Advances) Account to each of the arrante provided in the artificate the of the said Public Works Loans (Advances) Account to each of the agents specified in the certificate the amount of the advances which he is authorised to receive and the signature of each of the said agents shall be a sufficient discharge to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England. 4.—(I) No order signed in pursuance of Regula-tion 3 shall be delivered to the agent named therein unless that agent has paid the amount of the fees payable in respect of the advance. (2) The receipt for any such fee as aforesaid pay-able in respect of any advance shall be signed by the officer in charge of the accounts or, in his absence, by such person as may be nominated by the Secretary or Assistant Secretary to the Loan Commissioners.

5. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1945 and on that date the Regu-lations made on the 1oth day of November, 1944 (S.R. & O. 1944 No. 1251), under the Public Works Loans Act, 1875 shall be rescinded.
