Venice, June 17. Our last Letters from Verona give an Account, that the Imperial Army continued encamped near that Place, and Count Palfinear Cologna, where they expected more Forces from Germany by the way of Bassane, and in the mean time were gathering together a great number of Beats and a quantity of Timber, in order to make a Bridge over the Adigs; And fresher Advices say, that 5000 Imperial Foot and 3000 Horse had already passed the River, about 15 Miles below Legnano. 'Tis said, the French are laying a Bridge over the Adige at Gossolingo. The French Soldiers having committed several Disorders in the Veroneze, the Prince of Vaudemons has been obliged to pay 2000 Crowns by way of Satisfaction to the Inhabitants. The Emperor's Ambassador had Audience yesterday of the Senate.

Mittam, June 13. Advice being come, that a Body of Swedish Forces, under the command of General Reinschild, are advanced in the Neightburhood of Cockenhausen, Major-General Robell is gone from hence to command the Garrison there, and 5 Saxon Regiments are passed the Dwina in order to cover that Place. The rest of the Saxon Forces are preparing to pass that River, and they expect a considerable Reinsorcement from Muscovy.

Cop nhagen, June 18. A Treaty was figned the 11th Instant between the King of Denmark and the States General of the United Provinces, whereby 14000 Danes are to be sent to the Assistance of the States; and in case Denmark shall be attacked, the States are to send back the said 14000 Men, and assist us with 14000 more, or else with a Squadron of Men of War. The King of Denmark went from hence the 15th Instant, to review his Troops in Holstein. The Forces that are to be sent to Holland, have received Orders to be in a readiness to march.

The Employments of Prefident of the Council of War, and of Governor of this City, vacant by the Death of Count Stan remberg, are not yet disposed of. General Gronfeld is gone from hence to Hangary, to command the Imperial Forces in that Country. Several Persons have lately been seized there, and in this City, upon fuspicion of being concerned in the late Conspiracy.

Colegne, June 24. Our Garrison was reinsorced two days ago by 5 Companies of the Bishop of Munster's Forces, and General Thungen is appointed to command here, in case there is any danger of our being attacked by the French. The Blector Palarine has given Orders for levelling the Ground about the Town of Juliers, and for demoishing all the Buildings near that Place which might be of use to an Enemy in case of a Stage. About 6000 Men of the Forces of Lin nouigh and Hiffe. Cassel are come to Santen, not far from Wesl., and will fhorely be joined by the Forces of the King of Pruffix and other Princes, in order to form a Camp in rhole Parts.

Hamburgh, June 24. The Duke of Helften Gos-torp went from hence yesterday to Kel. Letters The Duke of Helftein Gozfrom Livenia give an Account, that several Swed.fb Regiments were arrived at Revol from Steek-ko'm, Careisbawn, and other Places, to the number of 2000 Horse and 10000 Foot; that 6000 Men more were expected from Sweden, and that as fron as these Forces are got together, the King of Sweden will march towards Plethow. They write from Warfam, that the General Diet affembled there has defined the King of Poland to make a Peace with Swed n, and to lend home his Saxon Forces: and that an Answer was returned, That the King is very willing to comply with the Defires of the Diet, and that the said Forces should march home in a thort time, provided the Flaces which they have proficiled themselves of in Livonia may be garritoned by the Forces of the Republick.

Bruffels, June 28. About 800 Wagens are come from the French Conquests to Geiderland laden with Ammunition, &c. and the Franch are providing great Trains of Artillery at Louvain, Cham, and Antwerp. 'Tis faid, that Monlieur de Bagnols has received a Commission from Spain, to be Intendant-General of Justice and the Finances in these Provinces. 'Tis said likewise, that Orders are fent to several of the Principal Nobility of this Country, to raife Troops at their own Charge for the Service of the King of Spain. The Count de Bergeick is expecting a Commission from Spain, to be Comptroller-General of the Revenues of these Countries. A farther Order is expected, to flop the Payment of all Pensions, which occasions a great Diffarisfaction among those that are concerned. Don Quiros is come hither from Aix la Chapelle, and will shortly return to the Hague.
