**Cologne, June 28.** The new Levies for the Service of the Elector of Cologne are continued. A Reinforcement of 200 Horse of the Troops of the King of Prussia is shortly expected in our Garrison.

**Hamburg, June 28.** The Duke of Holstein Gottorp returned hither yesterday from Kiel, and Count Czerninski, Ambassador from France to the King of Denmark, came to this Place the same day from Copenhagen. Letters from Warsaw of the 16th Instant say, the General Diet of Poland were still assembled, but had not yet made any Progress in the Business referred to them by the King's Circular Letters, and that most of the Deputies were of opinion, that the Diet should be put off till September next; that in the mean time, the King might make a Peace with Sweden, and send home his Saxon Forces, and that further Endeavours might be used to reconcile the House of Sapsieha and the Contendered Nobility of Lithuania. Letters from Lithuania give an Account, that the Country People there have in several Places taken up Arms in favour of the House of Sapsieha, and commit great Spoils upon the Estates of those of the contrary Party.

**Brussels, July 1.** The Marquis of Bedmar is gone from hence to view the great Line which is making from Antwerp to Liere, and so on to Dieff, and will shortly take a Review of the Forces in the Spanish Pay, which are ordered to draw together for that purpose by the 15th Instant in two Bodies, one in Flanders, and the other in Brabant. Orders are given for sending to Gelderland a great quantity of Ammunition, which is come to Namur by Water from Ghent and Charlermont. Letters from Madrid of the 17th past say, the King of Spain would shortly go to Arragon, and take the usual Oath for maintaining the Privileges of that Kingdom; and that the Marquis de Castell Rodrigo parted from Madrid the 8th, being sent with the Character of Ambassador Extraordinary to Turin, to demand the Princess of Savoy in Marriage for the King his Master, and to conduct her to the Court of Spain.

**Hague July 1.** The Forces of this State are going to form two Camps, one near Nimeguen, and the other near Bergenopzoom. The French continue to make great Magazines in Gelderland, and their Troops are cantoned near our Frontiers. All the Advices from Italy say, the Germans have passed the River Adige.

**Paris, July 2. N. S.** The Court will return this evening from Marly to Versailles. The Deputies of the States of Languedoc had Audience of the King last week, being presented by the Duke de Maine Governor of that Province; The Bishop of Alais Deputy from the Clergy, spoke for them. Since the King has established two Directors of the Finances, Monsieur Hericourt's Office, whose Business it was to correspond with the several Intendants in the Provinces, is suppressed. It has been resolved in the Councils of State at Versailles and Madrid, That every Grandee of Spain shall not only be received and treated here as Duke and Peer of France, but shall actually have Patents as such, and assume the Title upon all Occasions; The Dukes and Peers of France are likewise to enjoy all the Privileges of Grandees of Spain, and to take upon them that Title, as they do other Honours Hereditary in their Families. Letters from Venice of the 17th past, which came in yesterday say, the Germans had passed the Adige near Castell-Baldo, and were advanced as far as Carpi, from whence a small Body of French that were posted there, immediately retired, leaving

an open Field for the Imperialists to proceed to Legnano, where the French were drawn together to receive them, which puts us in expectation of hearing of some Action.
