Importation of Dogs and Cats (Amendment) Order of 1945.

I. Amends the Importation of Dogs and Cats Order of 1928 so as to allow licences authorising the im-

portation of dogs owned by members of H.M. Army, Navy or Air Force to be issued by a Commissioned Officer of H.M. Army, authorised in that behalf by an Assistant Under-Secretary of State, The War Office.

II. Provides that such dogs shall be detained and isolated for six months on premises which have been approved for that purpose by or on behalf of the Secretary of State for War and which are under the control of the Royal Army Veterinary Corps.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 90 of 1945.
Subject.

Declares an area comprising such parts of the counties of Southampton, West Sussex and Wilts as lie within approximately 15 miles of Southampton and Fareham, Hants to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 91 of 1945.
Subject.

Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Bradley, Bilston, Staffs to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The Area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Salop, Stafford, Warwick and Worcester.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (GENERAL INTERIM DEVELOPMENT) ORDER, 1945.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Town Council of the County Borough of Grimsby have, with the consent of the Minister of Town and Country Planning, given a Direction under Article 5 of the Town & Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1945, with respect to an area of land situate in the County Borough and more particularly described in the First Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

All that land situate within the County Borough of Grimsby which is bounded by a line commencing at a point on the Northerly rail track of the main railway of the London & North Eastern Railway in line with the Westerly side of Cartergate, and proceeding,

Thence to and along the Westerly side of Cartergate in a Northerly direction to its junction with the Northerly side of Maude Street.

Thence along the Northerly side of Maude Street in an Easterly direction to its junction with the Easterly side of Flottergate.

Thence along the Easterly side of Flottergate in a Southerly direction to its junction with the Northerly side of Victoria Street West.

Thence along the Northerly side of Victoria Street West to its junction with Victoria Street South.
