Constantinople, April 18. N. S.

THE Grand Signior left this Place some weeks ago, and arrived at *Adrianople* the 10th Instant; and the Grand Visier will begin his Journey thither to morrow. Yesterday the Venetian Ambassador had Audience of the Grand Visier, by whom he was splendidly Entertained, and the Visier delivered to him the Rati- fication of the Treaty of Peace between the Re- publick of *Venice* and the Grand Signior. The *Janizar* Aga is made Bishaw of *Musul*, and the *Seimas* Bishaw succeeds him as Aga of the *Janizaries*. An Account is come from *Affis*, that the *Arabs* who had taken up Arms against the *Turks*, are dispersed, and have quitted *Bassora*, into which the *Turks* put a Garrison.

Cadix, June 6. The 31st Instant arrived here a French Man of War, with 3 Fire-Ships, 2 Bomb- Ketches, and 1 Store-Ship, from *Toulon*. The Count *d'Estrees's* Squadron are gone up to the *Pantale*; More French Men of War are expected from *Toulon*, who are to bring Cannon from *Burizama*, which are to be placed on the new Fortifica- tions that are making here. Several Regiments of Horse and Foot are coming to this Coast from *Catalonia*, who are to have their Rendezvous at *Xru*.

Madrid, June 17. The King has declared his Resolution of going to *Aragon* to take the usual Oath of maintaining the Privileges of that King- dom. On the 13th the Marquis *de Castell Roivigo* set out for *Savoy*, to fetch the new Queen of *Spain*, which Journey he performs at his own Charge. The Council of State met the 14th, and the King acquainted them with the Regulation that is made for giving the Rank of Dukes and Peers in *France* to the Grandees, and reciprocally that of Grandees to the French Dukes and Peers, which 'tis said, some of the Council opposed, and were answered, That the Matter was not to be dis- puted. A German, who was formerly Secretary to the Countess of *Berlins*, was lately seized at *Talis*, and brought Prisoner hither, and 'tis or- dered, that he be forthwith sent out of the King- dom.

Rome, June 18. The Pope has resolved to aug- ment his Forces to 9000 Foot, 2000 Horse, and 1000 Dragoons; And 'tis said, a Proposal has been made to sell divers Publick Offices to raise Money for these extraordinary Expences.

Mantua, June 22. A Party of 60 German Horse has made Excursions on the Frontiers of this Dutchy, which the French having notice of, they sent out a stronger to intercept them; but the Germans retired without any loss. The French, to hinder the March of the Germans, have in se- veral Places cut the Banks of the River *Tartare*, by which means divers low Lands of the Coun- ties of *Mantua*, *Verona*, and *Ferrara*, are laid un- der water.

From the French Camp near *Legnano*, June 23. Marshal *de Catinat* having received Advice, that the Germans had made a Bridge over the *Adige* near *Castelbaldo*, and that part of their For- ces had passed the same, he sent Monsieur *de*

St. Fremond with a strong Detachment of Horse and Foot, and 6 Pieces of Cannon, to *Carpi*, to secure that Post, where they cast up some Works. The Germans have made a Bridge on the River *Tar- taro* at *la Candia*, and sent over a Party of Foot and Dragoons, who have intrenched themselves on the other side at the Entrance of *Val Ferrarese*; upon which Marshal *de Catinat* has ordered a strong Detachment to pass the River *Minago*, and to advance to *Ostiglia*, to cover the Dutchy of *Mantua*, and to oppose the Germans passing the *Po* at *Ponte de Lago Oscuro*, as they give out they intend to do. The main Body of the Imperial Army are posted on the other side of the *Adige* not far from their Bridge, and besides the Detach- ments they have on this side the River, they have one at *St. Martins* near *Verma*.

From the Imperial Camp near *Atcole*, June 24. The 16th Instant, Prince *Eugene* marched from *St. Martins* near *Verona*, leaving Prince *Charles* of *Vaudmont* with a Body of Horse to secure that Post, and the Army encamped at this Place, be- tween *Verona* and *Legnano*. A strong Party of our Troops have passed the *Adige* near *Castelbaldo*, where they have made a Bridge over that River, and have built Forts on each side to secure it. The French move along the River to observe us; which our whole Army will pass as soon as our heavy Artillery are arrived, which we expect every day, with divers Wagons laden with Ammuni- tion under the Convoy of 5000 Men; And 'tis said, they bring with them divers Boats of a new Invention, which are extream light of Carriage, and very commodious for passing of Rivers. The French have demolished their Bridge at *Goffal- lingo*, the Current of the River being so rapid, that it carried away their Boats. Two Regiments of the Duke of *Savoy's* Forces have lately joined the French Army.

Rivole, June 27. The French and Spanish Forces have formed several Camps; Several Regiments are posted at this Place; another Detachment lies at *Goffalingo*; Prince *Vaudmont* is encamped at *Chiesia di David*; Marshal *de Catinat* near *Legnano*; Monsieur *de St. Fremond* at *Carpi*, part of whose Troops are advanced as far as *Burichella*, and Monsieur *Vaubecourt* between *Ponte Molino* and *Ostiglia*. The Imperial Army lie near *Castelbaldo*, having as yet sent only some Detachments over the *Adige*.

Mittaw in *Cowland*, June 27. General *Steman* arrived here some days ago from *Warsaw*, and is gone to *Cockenhausen*, to take upon him the Com- mand of the Saxon Forces which are drawing to- gether near that Place, and expect the Body of Men which the Czar of *Moscow* has promised to send to their Assistance.

Vinna, June 25. Baron *Wizer*, Chancellor to the Elector *Palatine*, is come hither from *Dussel- dorp*, to settle Matters in relation to the Forces of his Electoral Highness, which are to join the Imperial Army on the *Rhine*. The Regiment of Foot which the Bishop of *Osnabruc* raises for the Emperor's Service is almost compleat, and will consist of 2500 Men. The Emperor has appoint- ed Prince *Christian* of *Hanover* to be Major-Gener- al of his Forces in *Germany*. The Regiment of

Italy: commanded by Colonel Paul Diack are ordered to march to *Italy*. Count *Bucellini*, Chancellor of the Court, and Secretary *Eylar*, are returned hither from *Newshad*, where they have been to examine the Persons who are Prisoners there on account of the late Conspiracy; 'Tis said, some of them have confessed several Particulars of this Plot, and that among others, the *Sieur Sirmay* owned, that some Letters which were produced, were his own Hand-writing; but Prince *Ragezzi* denies the whole Matter. The *Marquis de Briancon* is come hither from *Poland*, where he has been with the Character of Envoy from the Duke of *Savoy*, and intends in 2 or 3 days to continue his Journey to *Piedmont*.

Frankfort, July 3. The *Sieur Obrecht*, who has resided here some time as the Most Christian King's Plenipotentiary for settling Matters in relation to the Dutche's of *Orleans's* Pretensions on the *Palatinate*, is ordered to *Strasburgh*, where the *Marshal de Villeroy*, who is to command the *French Army* on the *Rhine*, was expected the 1st Instant. They write from *Ratisbonne*, that *Baron Seylern*, one of the Emperor's Commissioners there, has notified to the Imperial Diet the Decrees of the *Aulick Council*, whereby the Duke of *Mantua*, for giving up his Country to the *French*, is declared to have forfeited the same, and his Subjects are freed from their Allegiance to him.

Hamburgh, July 3. The King of *Denmark* came this day to *Rensburgh* in *Holstein*, in order to review his Forces in that Country, after which he will return to *Copenhagen*. The last Letters from *Livonia* give an Account, that several Regiments were arrived at *Revel* from *Sweden*, and further Succours were daily expected; after whose arrival, 'twas said the King of *Sweden* would march towards *Riga*.

Brussle, July 3. The *French* make great Magazines of Ammunition and Provisions in these Parts; In the mean time their Forces continue in their Quarters. A Company of 300 *French Miners* passed through this City some days ago in their March to *Gelderland*. Several Captains of the new Levies of Horse that are ordered to be made in these Countries for the *Spanish Service*, have given up their Commissions, because they have not Money enough allowed them to buy Horses. The Ministers of this Court have had several Meetings, about putting in execution the Orders come from *Spain*, for retrenching divers Pensions and Offices.

Hague, July 8. The *Sieur Bondeli*, Envoy from the King of *Prussia*, had Publick Audience yesterday of the States General. The Countess Dowager of *Nassau*, with the young Prince Scadholder of *East-Frisland*, her Son, are come hither from *Leerwarden*. We have an Account from the Frontiers of *Flanders*, that the *Marshal de Boufflers* and the *Marquis de Bedmar* had been to view the new Lines which the *French* are making, and that they had ordered a Bridge to be made over the *Scheld* near *Antwerp*.

Paris, July 9. N. S. By Letters from *Legnano* in the *Veronize* of the 27th past we have an Account, that *Marshal de Catinat* was encamped near that Place with the main Body of the *French Army*, their Troops extending as far as *Carpi*; That the *German Advanced Guards* were within Cannon-shot of them, and that several Skirmishes had happened. Prince *Eugene* was encamped near *Casalbato* with near 30000 Men, and had sent a Detachment to make a Bridge over the River *Taro* at *la Caudia*.

Perthmouth, June 29. The Squadron of His Majesty's Ships under the Command of Vice-Admiral *Hobson*, passed by the Isle of *Wight* on Thursday last from *Ireland*, sailing towards the Coast of *Holland* with His Majesty's Forces which are sent to the Assistance of the States-General of the United Provinces.

Whitehall, July 2. The King went from *Hampton-Court* last Monday morning, and lay that night at *Canterbury*; His Majesty came to *Margate* yesterday about noon; and went on board His Yacht; And about Four in the afternoon, the Yachts, and Men of War appointed to attend His Majesty in His Passage, under the Command of Rear-Admiral *Munden*, set sail for *Holland*.
