N Wednelday last His Highnels the Prince of Tuscany was pleased to give a Visit to His Grace the Duke of Albemarie at Nemball, where he was received with all possible respect, and that the same Night he lodged at Co chester. Thursday his said Highness arrived here, and having taken a View of the Town and Port, passed to Languard Fort, where Major Darre Lthe Governor received him with all the Honour and Military Ceremony which could be given him in that place. On Friday His Highnels fet fail for Holland in the Yacht appointed for his Transportation.
Libonne; May 25. The 18th instant Sir William Go-

dolphin lately arrived here from England, had his Publick Audience from the Prince and Prince's, to which he was conducted in the Princes Coach by Don Lucas de tor-

Dantzick, May 30. They are also advised, that a considerable party of the Collacks having united themselves to the Turks intended to invade the Frontiers; that having f braitted themselves to the protection and jurisdiction of the Grand S gnior; they had commanued the Ecclesiastical Greeks in Uhrania to declare their fubmission; by praying in publick for the Grand Segnior , which they refused to do , but all of them agreed to pray for the Great Duke of Molovy, as being of the same Faith and Religion with themselves.

Madrids May 30. The Queen Regent has been lately much diffempered with an extraordinary pain in her head? occofion'd by a window left open upon her in her retirements during whole indisposition the Marquis & Aytona has kept a more then usual Guardabout the Pallace.
