Venice, July 1. N. S. Letters from *Vicenza* of the 29th past say, 46 Pieces of Cannon, for the use of the German Forces, were come down from *Roveredo* under the Convoy of a Regiment of Cuirassiers commanded by the Prince of *Darmstadt*, and that on the 27th at night, 12000 Germans passed the Canal *Bianco*; And 'tis said, that a Detachment of their Troops has likewise passed the *Po*, and are entred into the Country of *Ferrara* belonging to the Pope; That 4000 guard the Pass of the Canal *Bianco*, and 4000 are posted at *Castelbaldo*, expecting more Forces with their Artillery: The French make frequent Marches and Countermarches to observe the Germans, and they have prepared Bridges at several Places on the *Adige*. 'Tis said, the Governor of *Milan* has received Orders from *Madrid*, to Confiscate the Estates of all the Subjects of that Duchy who are in the Emperor's Service, of which number is the Marquis of *Visconti*, now in the German Army. An Express arrived here the 26th past from *Constantinople*, who brings an Account, that Signior *Soranzo*, the Venetian Ambassador, had Audience the 17th of April of the Grand Visier, from whom he received the C. and Signior's Ratification of the Treaty of Peace between the Port and this Republick, at which the Mustá was present, who told the Ambassador, That the Grand Signior had Sworn upon the Alcoran to observe the Peace inviolably; After which, the Ambassador and the Gentlemen of his Retinue were presented with Caskets, and splendidly entertained. Signior *Soranzo* having thus performed his Commission, is preparing to return home, and Signior *Giustiniani* is appointed to reside at *Constantinople* as Baylo or Ambassador in Ordinary from this Republick.

Vienna, June 29. The Emperor being informed, that the Court of France are sending a further Reinforcement to their Army in Italy, his Imperial Majesty has resolved to do the like, and has already appointed the Regiments of *Lorraine* and *Ravenslau* for that Service; and 'tis said, several other Imperial Regiments will be sent thither. The Letters from Prince *Eugene* of the 19th Instant give an Account, that 3000 Imperialists under the Command of General *Palffy*, passed the *Adige* the 14th at *l'Abbadia* below *Legnana* without any opposition, and cast up Retrenchments to secure the Passage or the other Regiments; That Prince *Eugene*, and the Prince of *Commercy* were gone to *l'Abbadia*, having left Prince *Charles* of *Vaudemont* with part of the Army at *St. Michael*; That on the 15th the French attempted to lay a Bridge over the *Adige* near *Pescantina*, in order to intercept the Artillery, and the Imperial Troops which were not yet come up from *Roveredo*; but that Prince *Charles* of *Vaudemont* had hitherto hindered their putting that Design in execution. Prince *Raguzzi* has been several times examined at *Newstadt*, and denies the Matters he is charged with; But 'tis said, the Sieur *Sirmay*, who is likewise accused of the Conspiracy, does not go about to justify himself, but calls himself upon the Emperor's Mercy.

Frankfort, July 6. The Forces of *Swabia* and *Frankonia* are marching from their Quarters to the General Rendezvous; and Prince *Lewis* of *Baden* is shortly expected at *Heilbron* to counter with the Deputies of those Estates, in order to adjust Matters about the said Forces

joining the Imperial Army on the Rhine. The Queen Dowager of Denmark is come to Mentz, in her way to Aix la Chapelle.

Hamburgh, July 2. The King of Denmark is at Rensburgh, to take a Review of his Forces in the Neighbourhood of that Place, after which he intends to go to Gelnhausen; He has appointed the Field-Marshal Saxon-Low to Command the Danish Forces now in Saxony, which are going into the Emperor's Service, and his said Duke Charles of Wirtemberg is to Command the Danish Regiments that are to be sent to the Assistance of the States-General of the United Provinces. Letters from *Lisbon* of the 20th of the last month give an Account that the King of Sweden was on his March with part of his Army towards *Riga*, having left the rest of his Forces under the Command of General *Welling* on the Frontiers of *Moscovy*. They write from *Mittaw*, that a Body of *Moscovites* have joined the Saxon Forces near *Cochenhausen*, and that further Reinforcements of the Czar's Forces were, daily expected. Letters from *Saxony* say, the Danish Forces that are put into the Emperor's Service, had Orders to march to the *Rhine*.

Brussels, July 12. A Review of the Spanish Forces in these Countries is appointed on the 25th Instant. The Ministers of this Court have met several times to consider of Proposals for Farming the King of Spain's Revenues; They have begun to put in execution the Orders lately come from *Spain*, for suppressing divers Offices, which occasions a great deal of discontent. Letters from *Ferrara* of the 29th past give an Account, that 1000 Imperial Horse had passed the *Po*, and were entred into the *Ferrarese*, and that the rest of the Imperial Army were going to pass that River. Prince *Eugene* of *Saroy* had sent to the Cardinal Legate of *Ferrara*, to desire he would give Directions that the Imperial Forces might be furnished with Forrage and Provisions, for which they would pay ready Money.

Hague, July 12. The States of *Holland* and *West-Friseland* will meet again to-morrow. They write from *Louvain*, that the *Secur Bagnols* Intendant of the French Forces, has been there to confer with the Marshal *de Boufflers*; And that 'tis said, the French and Spanish Forces will shortly march from their Quarters in order to encamp.

Paris, July 13. N. S. A Courier arrived here the 10th Instant from Marshal *de Carinat*, with Letters of the 2d, which advise, that 1000 Imperial Horse had passed the *Po* near *Castel Gulichno*, and that Marshal *de Carinat* had thereupon made a Bridge a little above *Ojziglia*, and had posted 4000 Men at *Scalazia*. The Imperial Army consisted of 30000 Men when these Letters came away, and Prince *Eugene* expected several other Regiments from *Trent*, and when they had joined him, his Army would be 45000 strong. Letters from *Lisbon* say, a Treaty was signed there the 18th past between the Crowns of *France*, *Spain*, and *Portugal*; but the Particulars are not yet certainly known. Letters from *Madrid* of the 30th past say, the King of *Spain* had fixed the 16th Instant for his departure to *Barcelona*, where he intends to meet the Queen, and that he had named the Prince *Ursula* to accompany the Queen in her Journey from *Turin* to *Spain*. Three Spanish Men of War and 4 Gallies have joined Count *a'Estrees*'s Squadron at *Cadix*.

Deal, July 4. Sir *George Rooke* came to the Downs last Wednesday, and hoisted the Union Flag on board His Majesty's Ship the *Triumph*, and sailed the same day with 5 Men of War to join the Fleet at *Spithead*.

Westminster, July 5. This day Sir *Thomas Trevor* Kt. appointed by His Majesty to be Lord Chief Justice of the Common-Pleas, was made a Serjeant at Law, with the usual Ceremonies; After which he gave a splendid Entertainment at *Serjeants-Inn* in *Fleet-street* to the Judges, Serjeants, and other Persons of Quality; And in the Afternoon, he went, accompanied by two of the Judges, in the usual manner, to the Lord Keeper's, where he was sworn Lord Chief Justice of the Common-Pleas.

Whitehall, July 5. An Account is come this day, that His Majesty arrived in the *Maeje* last Thursday about 9 in the morning. The Squadron of His Majesty's Ships commanded by Rear-Admiral *Munden*, which attended His Majesty in His Passage thither, returned yesterday into the Downs.
