The Treasury hereby give notice pursuant to the provisions of Section 20 of the Finance (No. 2) Act 1940 that they propose to make an Order directing that from a date to be specified therein Purchase Tax shall be reduced from 33\frac{1}{3}\% to 16\frac{2}{3}\% on household goods of celluloid, bakelite or other plastic material derived from cellulose, casein, papier maché or synthetic resin, being goods of a kind used in the preparation or serving of food or drink.
