Tarmouth, June 11.

A Great Fleet of Laden Colliers hath within these two or three dayes passed through this Road to the Southwards, of whom about One hundred were by change of wind obliged to come to an Anchor about *Corton*; but this day the wind serving them, set sail again in pursuance of their company.

Lisbone, May 29. For some months past three Fregats have been fitting up (as was given out) for the better security against the Turks Men of War, the Count de Prado, (design'd Ambassador to the Court of Rome) in his Voyage. But on Friday the 24th instant the King was about 12 of the Clock the same night, convey'd out of his Palace by the Conde de Prado and others to the Bay of *S. Catherine's*, where the ships lay at Anchor, about a league from the Town; but the night proving extraordinarily tempestuous (with much thunder and lightning, so as not to suffer them to reach the Fregats) was the remainder of that night and the next day secur'd in an adjoining Convent, till 3 in the afternoon; at which hour they actually embarked him for his *Terceras*. One *Francisco de Britto*, a person whose for his Conduct, Valour, and other accomplishments, was rais'd to the Charge of Vice-Admiral of Portugal, was made choice of to convey His Majesty thither, and to be made Governour of the Island and Fortres, and even of the person of the King, which he was won upon to accept of; and accordingly on Friday night swore Fidelity to the Prince in all that was committed to him, and took his leave with entire satisfaction; but being afterwards prest (as 'tis said) to some points wherein he thought his honour and conscience too much concern'd, he retir'd himself much dissatisfied to the Jesuits Colledge of the *Noviciats*, where (though at an unseasonable hour) he got admittance. Immediately upon the noise of this accident an old Colonel, one *Manoel Nunes Leffan*, who was nam'd as second in that Charge, in case *Francisco de Britto* failed, began also to refuse the Employment, but was at the last over-perswadet, and his Son joyn'd with him as his Assistant. *Francisco de Britto* was on Monday following forcibly taken from the Colledge to which he had retir'd himself, and made close Prisoner in the Tower of *Belom*.

The King was embark'd upon the same Ship with the Conde de Prado, and is this Evening under sail, having been till now detain'd by contrary winds in the River.

Danishick, June 7. From *Couingsburgh* we are inform'd that the Baptisme of the young Prince of *Brandenburgh* was there lately solemniz'd with much Ceremony and rejoicing; he had for Godfathers King *Casimir* the late King of *Poland*, the Prince of *Danemark*, the Duke *Christian de Meersbach*, and the Dukes of *Brunswick* and *Lunenburgh*, and for Godmothers the Queen and Princess of *Danemark*, the Princess of *Saxony*, the Duchesse of *Meersbach*, the Lady Landgrave of *Cassel*, the Duchesse Dowager of *Hoffstein Götterp*, and the Duchesse of *Curland*; and was call'd by the Name of *Philip William*; but that which took off somewhat from the universal joy of that place, was a sudden fire, which happen'd the 4th instant, which in little time burnt down about 80 Houses.

From *Warsaw* we are told that the Diet have lately establish'd a Chamber or Court of Justice, compos'd of Senators and several Waywoods and other persons out of the several Provinces of *Poland*, in which the Marshal *Sobiesky* is to sit as President; to which Court is to be committed the

Care of all Affairs concerning the Crown, during the present *Interregnum*, and to give Orders for the prevention of Disorders, Thefts, and Murders, which have since this great Concourse of people to the City, been hourly committed; about 40 people having almost every night been found dead in and about the City.

The Foreign Ministers and Ambassadors have solicited the Primate the Archbishop of *Gnesne*, that he would encourage their speedy admission to their Audience from the Diet, but this will not be granted them; till they have first concluded all the preliminaries in order to the Election.

The *Moscovite* Ambassadors are upon their way hither, but 'tis conceiv'd they have wholly laid aside all thoughts of soliciting any farther the Election of their young Prince to the Crown of *Poland*, which we the rather believ, since we are inform'd, that the Great Duke is so extremely dejected and afflicted at the loss of his Duchesse, that he has taken up a firm resolution to retire himself from the management of all publick affairs; intending to commit the administration of all businesses of State into the hands of the young Prince his Son.

They farther advise, that the Tartars have already begun to make incursions into *Ukrania*, and that the Cossacks are uniting themselves with the Turks and others their Allies, to give some disturbance to the Frontiers of *Poland*.

Genova, June 5. Yesterday pass'd by in view of this Port the French Gallies from the Isle of *Hieres*, bound for *Civita Vecchia*, to joyn with the Popes Squadron for the Expedition into the *Levant*, and may in 2 or 3 dayes be followed by the Men of War from *Thoulon*.

The Earl of *Winchillesa*, late Ambassador from His Majesty of *Great Britain* into *Turky*, is daily expected here from *Legorn*, for whose reception Signior *Gio. Augustino Durazzo's* Pallace is fitting up and furnishing, and one of the Gallies of this Republick now attending at *Legorn* for his transportation.

Two of the Senators of this Republick being lately deceased; some stop has been made to the Election of the next person, out of which number was to be chosen the successor Duke.

From *Rome* we are told; that Signior *Balz Vincenz. Köspigioski* was put to sea from *Cluiza Vecchia* with the Popes Gallies and succors; and had taken the way towards *Candia*.

From *Milan* we are advis'd, that the present Governour the Marquis de *los Balbates Spinola* was with his Lady and Family; and a great part of the Court; gone for *Varese* in a journey of Devotion; and that there has been lately held a Synod of the Clergy at *Milan*, in which several Orders have been made for the reformation of several things in the Ecclesiastical State; and that the Cardinal Archbishop took an occasion in the Assembly with much zeal to admonish the Priests, and stir them up to do the duties of their Calling; and has prevail'd with the Assembly to take care that strict and rigorous punishment be inflict'd on such persons as shall refuse or neglect to give obedience to what has been concluded by them in this Synod.

From *Turin* they write, that the 20th past the Duke of *Savoy* return'd hither from *Venaria*, but intends in few dayes to pass thence for *Rivoli*, to divert himself in his beloved exercise of Hunting.

Colonel *Albored*, who in chief commands the *Savoy* forces in *Candia* (for whose recruits he some time since returned

turned to *Turin*) is gone lately for *Venice*, accompanied by several Officers, all of them designed for *Candia*, to give the Republick of *Venice* the best assistance they are able for the defence of that place; and 'tis said the Duke has been pleased to bestow upon the said Colonel a Jewel to the value of 70 double Ducats, as a testimony of his favour, and the esteem he has of his merits.

Hambourgh, June 7. We suddenly expected here an Assembly of several persons, with Commissaries to examine and come to some resolution about the Differences between his Majesty of *Denmark* and the Duke of *Holsheim*, and their Pretensions to the County of *Oldenburg*.

From *Stockholme* we are informed, that the Envoyé of *Tartary* not being satisfied with the first Present of Cloth and Moneys lately made him from His Majesty, has been since dismiss'd with a double Present to his contentment and full satisfaction.

The 20th of the last Month happened a great fire in *Gottenburgh*, which in few hours destroyed a great part of the Town, together with the Church and Town-House.

From *Berlin* we are informed, that the Channel which has been long undertaken between that City and the River *Odér*, is lately finish'd, and a convenient way of Trade by that means opened into *Silesia*; and that they are there full of joy for the news of the birth of a young Prince the 19th past at *Cönigsbergh*.

Brussels, June 13. Upon Complaint made to the Constable of *Castille* that the Magistrates of *Namur* had required a Tribute, or Contribution to be paid to them by the inhabitants of a Village called *Pemale* in the County of *Liege*, he was pleas'd to send to the said Magistrates, and to forbid them to levy any sums upon them by vertue of the said Impositions; but that they should on both sides give him due information of their pretensions.

The 8th instant arriv'd here a Yacht from *Holland*, bringing hither two Deputies, sent from the States General of the *United Provinces*.

The Heer *Baumont*, a Councillour to and Deputy from the Prince of *Orange*, after several Conferences had here, and particularly with Monsieur *Pimentel* about the affairs relating to the said Prince, is returned again for the *Hague*, but 'tis not yet known what success he hath had in his Negotiation.

Dendermont is fortifying with all convenient diligence, and the work well advanced, consisting of 7 Bâtions, all of them well lined with hewen stone.

The French employ 6 or 7000 men in the Fortifications of *Aeths*, where they are building a Citadel which in little time may be finish'd and compleated.

Paris, June 15. Letters of the 4th instant inform us, that our Gallies though they have some times attempted to put out to sea from the Island of *Hiercs*, have been hitherto detain'd by contrary winds. They farther say, that all our forces are embark'd upon the War, which lie ready to sail with the first fair wind.

From *Malka* we are inform'd, that the Sieur de *la Haye* has been very successful in his Negotiations with the Grand Segnior, as to the advantages of our Merchants in point of Trade, and was resolv'd to send a more than usual Ambassadour to his Majesties Court, and more particularly, that the Bassa of *Morea* was order'd to embark with the Character of Ambassadour upon one of the Men of Men of War under the Command of Monsieur d' *Almeras*.

Paris, June 19. Our last Letters from *Thoulon* tell us, that the Gallies are put to sea from the Isle of *Hiercs*, as also that the Duke de *Beaufort* upon the arrival of an Express the 5th instant, immediately put to sea from that Road with the rest of the Fleet under his Command, with a favourable wind.

From *Rome* we are also inform'd, that the Popes Gallies endeavour'd to put to sea the first instant from *Civita Vecchia*, but the wind proving contrary, forc'd them back again the next days, but after one dayes farther attendance, they set sail with a good wind.

From *Flanders* we are advic'd, that notwithstanding the release of the Coal-Boats which were formerly seized by the Spaniards at *Conde* and *St. Gislain*, the 13th instant several others which were intended for *Tournay* for the use of the Army, were stopp'd at *Corde*, which the Governour of *Tournay* has complain'd of in his Letter to Monsieur de *Louvois*, who has inform'd the Spanish Minister Don *Hieronimo de Quignones* thereof, desiring him to write to the Constable of *Castille* for their dismissal.

Monsieur de *la Barre* His Majesties principal Governour Commander in *America*, is lately returned hither, and has had several Conferences with Monsieur *Colbert* about the State of Affairs and Trade in those parts.

A stout ship is lately fitted up at the Port *St. Louis* in *Bretagne*, design'd for *Surat*, which is laden with Tapistry, Christalls, and other Merchandises, to the value of 20 thousand Crowns.

Yesterday Don *Hieronimo de Quignones*, Resident from the Crown of *Spain*, went in his Majesties Coach to have his last Audience, and take his solemn leave of their Majesties, in order to his return; Don *Michael Turiseta*, being lately arriv'd here from *Brussels* to succeed in his room.

Hague, June 18. The Heer *Charisus* is now upon his return homewards from hence to *Denmark*, and the Heer *Megerman* and *Vreibergen* for *Brussels*, whether they are desired by the States, to treat farther upon the business which has been some time under dispute between the States and the Admiralty of *Offend*, and some time negotiated here by the Heers *Bach* and *Wall*.

The Province of *Holland* has given in their resolution to the States General upon the Patents which the *West-India* Company of Merchants desired to have renew'd and confirm'd to them for 31 years longer, the result of the other Provinces upon the same subject is suddenly expected; as also upon a Proposition offer'd to them, that the standing forces may every year be oblig'd to draw together in two places upon the Frontiers, there to form a moving Camp, and to continue exercising themselves for a considerable part of the Summer; that so they may be the more ready and fit for service, when any occasion may offer it self for their employment.

The Princess Dowager of *Orange* expects daily the arrival of the Duchesses of *Frise* and *Simmeren* her Daughters.

The Heer *Bruineux* the States Agent at *Frankfort*, is order'd to go Resident to the Emperors Court at *Vienne*, and the Heer *Malapart* to supply his room at *Frankfort*.

Here is lately arriv'd the Baron of *Helmont* to negotiate about the differences with the Prince of *Liege* concerning the Castle of *la Rochete*, formerly seized by that Prince, pretending to the jurisdiction thereof.

The Heer *Van Beuning* is lately returned from *Frise-land*, and the Heer *Roemer* from his employment of Resident from the States in the City of *Hambourgh*.

The 16th instant arriv'd here incognito His Highness the Prince of *Tuscany*, but refus'd a Publick Entry and Entertainment, as he has done in the other places of his Travels.
