For some moneths past three Fregats have been fitting up (as was given out) for the better fecu-ricy against the Turks Men of War, the Count de Prado, (designed Ambassadour to the Court of Rome) in his Voyage. But on Friday the 24th instant the King was about 12 of the Clock the same night, conveyed out of his tolace by the Conde de Prado and others to the Bay of State Catherines, where the ships ay at Anchor, about a league from the Town; but the night proving extraordinarily tempelluous (with much thunder and lightning ; fo as not to suffer them to reach the Fregats) was the remainder of that night and the next day secured in an adjoyning Convent, till 3 in the afternoon; at which hour they actually imbarked him for the Terceras. One Francisco de Britto, a person who for his Conduct; Valour, and other accomplishments, was raised to the Charge of Vice-Admiral of Portugal, was made choice of to convey His Majesty thither, and to be made Governour of the Island and Fortrels, and even of the person of the King, which he was won upon to accept of 3 and accordingly on Friday night swore Fidelity to the Prince in all that was committed to him, and took his leave with entire farisfaction; but being afterwards prest (28 'tis said) to some points wherein ha thought his honour and confcience too much concernd, he retired himself much distaissted to the Jesuits Colledge of the Niviciats, where (though at an unleasonable hour) he goradmittance. Immediately upon the noise of this accident an old Colonel, one Manoel Nunct Lectan, who was named as second in that Charge, in case Francisco de Britto Estled, began also to resuse the Employment, but was at the last over-perswadet's and his Son joyned with him as his Affistant. Francifoo de Britto was on Monday following forcibly taken from the Colledge to which he had retired himself, and made close Prisoner in the Tower ot Belom.

The King was embarqued upon the 'lame Ship with the Conde de Prado, and is this Evening under sai', having been fill now detained by contrary winds in the River.

Panifick, June 7. From Coning to rgh we are informed that the Baprilme of the young Prince of Branden-bourgh was there lately folemaized with much Ceremony and rejoycing 5 he had for Godfathers King Caffmir the late King of Poland, the Prince of Danemark, the Duke Christian de Meersbach, and the Dukes of Brunswick and Lunenbourgh, and for Godmothers the Queen and Princess of Danemark, the Princess of Saxony, the Dinchess of Meersbach, the Lady Landigrave of Cassel, the Durchess Dowager of Hossiein Gottorp, and the Duchess of Eurland; and was called by the Name of Philip William; but that which took off somewhat from the universal joy of that place, was a sudden fire, which happened the 4th instant, which in little time burnt down about 80 Houses.

From Warfam we are told that the Diet have lately establish a Chamber or Court of Justice, composed of Senators and several Haywoods and other persons out of the several Provinces of Poland, in which the Mareshal Sobiesky is to be as a resident; to which Court is to be committed the

Care of silessire concerning the Crown, during the prefent Interregnum, and to give Orders for the preventions of Disorders, These, and Murders, which have since this great Concourse of people to the City, been hourly committed; about 40 people having almost every night been found dead in and about the City.

The Foreign Ministers and Ambassadors have folicited the Primate the Archbishop of Gnessie, that he woul incoutage their speedy admission to their Audience from the Diet, but this will not be granted them; till they have first concluded all the preliminaties in order to the Ele-

ction.

The Moscovite Ambassadors are upon their way hi her, but its conceived they have wholly laid aside all thoughts of solliciting any farther the Election of their young Pri ce to the Crown of Poland, which we the rather believ, since we are informed, that the Great Duke is so extreamly desected and afflicted at the loss of his Dutchess, that he has taken up a firm resolution to retire himself from the management of all publick affairs; intending to commit the administration of all businesses of State into the hands of the young Prince his Son.

They farther advise, that the Tartars have already began to make incursions into Ukrania, and that the Colacks are uniting themselves with the Turks and others their Allies, to give some diffurbance to the Frontiers of Paland.

Genoua, June 5. Yesterday passed by in view of this Port the French Gallies from the Isle of Hieres, bound for Civita Vecchia, to joyn with the Popes Squadron for the Expedition into the Levant, and may in 2 or 3 dayes be tellowed by the Men of War from Thoulon.

The Earl of Winchilfea, late Ambassadour from His Majesty of Great Britain into Turky, is daily expected here from Legora, for whose reception Segnior Gio. Augustino Durazzi's Pallace is fitting up and furnishing, and one of the Gallies of this Republick now attending at Le-

gorn for his transportation,

Two of the Senators of this Republick being lacy deceased; some stop has been made to the Election of the fact person, out of which number was to be chosen the succee 1 of Duke.

From Rôme we are told } that Seguior Bali Vincent & Sofrigliofi was put to sea from Cluita Vecchia with ne Popes Gallies and succors; and had taken the way toward Candia.

From Milan we are advised, that the present Governour the Marquis de los Balbates Spinola was with his Lady and Family; and a great part of the Courts gone for Varese in a journey of Devotion; and that there has been lately held a Synod of the Clergy at Milan; in which several Orders have been made for the reformation of several things in the Ecclesistical State; and that the Cardinal Archbishop took an occasion in the Assembly with much zeal to admonish the Priests, and this them up to slo the duties of their Callings; and has prevailed with the Assembly to take care that strict and rigorous punishment to inflicted on such persons as shall tesuse or neglect to give obedience to what has been concluded by them in this Synod.
