From Berlin we sre informed, that the Channel which has been long undertaken between that City and the River Od r, is lately finisht, and a convenient way of Trade by that means opened into Silefis; and that they are there full of joy for the news of the birth of a young Prince the 19.h pash at Coningsbergh.

Bruffells. June 13. Upon Complaint made to the Conftable of Csstille that the Magistra cs of Namur had required a Tribute or Contribution to be paid to them by the inbaoitants of a Village called **Penale** in the Conner of *Liege*, he was pleased to tend to the faid Magistrates, and to forbid them to levy any fums upon them by vertue of the faid Impositions; but that t'ey should on bo.h fides give him due information of their preventions.

The 8th inftant arrived here a Yacht from Holland, bringing hither two Deputies, fent from the States General of the United Provinces.

The Heer Bosumont, a Councellour 10 and Deputy from the Prince of Orange, after feveral Conferences had here, end particularly with Monsfeur Pimentel about the affairs relating to the faid Prince, is returned again for the Hague, but 'tis not yet known what fucces he hath had in his Negotiation.

Dendermon l is fortifying with all convenient diligence, and the work well advanced, confifting of 7 Britions, all of them well lined with hewen flone.

The French i.ploy 6 or 7000 men in the Fortifications of Aeths where they are building a Cittadel which in little time may be finished and compleated.

Paris, Fine 15. Letters of the 4th inftant inform us, that our Gallies though they have fome times attempted to put out to fea from the Island of Hieres, have been hitherto detained by contrary winds. They farther fay, that all our forces are embarked upon the War, which lie ready to fail with the first f it wind.

From Maltka we are informed; that the Sieur de la Haye has been very fuccefsful in his Negotiations with the Grand Segnior, as to the advantages of our Merchant in point of Trade, and was refolved to fend a more than ufual Ambaffadour to bis Majeflies Court, and more particularly, that the Baffa of Morea was ordered to embark with the Character of Ambaffadour upon one of the Men of Men of War under the Commend of Mosfieur d' Almeras.

Paris, \mathcal{F} ne 19. Our left Letters from Theulon tell us, that the Gallies are put to lea from the Isle of Hieres, as also that the Duke de Beaufort upon the attival of an Express the 5th instant, immediately put to lea from that Road with the rest of the Fleet under his Command 3 with a favourable wind.

From Rome we are also informed, that the Popes Gallies endeavoured to put to fea the first instant from *Civita* Vecchia, but the wind proving contrary, forced them back again the next days but after one dayes farther attendance, they fee fail with a good wind. From Flinders we are adviled, that notwithstanding the release of the Coal-Boats which we come by failed by the Spaniards at Conde and St. Giflain, the 13th initiant leverel others which were intended for Tournay for the ule of the ity, were thopped at condes which the Governous of Tournay has complained of in his Letter to Monfile : de Louvoy, who has informed the Sparith Minister Don Hieronimo de Quignones thereof, defining him to write to the Confiable of Castille for their difinifien.

Monfieur de la Barre His Ma'essis principal Governour Commander in America, islately returned hither, and has had several Conferences with Monssear Colbert about the state of Affairs and Trade in those parts.

A flour thip is lately fitted up at the Pot Sr. Louis in Bretagne, defigned for Surat, which is laden with Tapiftry, Chrittals, and other Merchandifes, to the value of 20 o thousand Crowns.

Yesterday Don Stronimo de Quignones , Relident from the Crown of Spain, went in his Majesties Coach to have his last Audience, and take his solemn leave of their Majesties, in order to his return, Don Michael Iturieta, being lately arrived here from Bruffels to succeed in his toom.

Hague, June 18. The Heer Charifiur is now upon his return homewards from hence to Denmark, and the Heers Megrman and Vreiberghen for Bruffels, whither they are diffued by the States, to treat farther upon the bulinels which has been fome time under dispute between the States and the Admiralty of Oftend, and fome time negotiated here by the Heers Bach and Wall.

The Province of Holland has given in their refolution to the States General upon the Patents which the Woj-Indy Company of Merchants defired to have renued and confirmed to them for 31 years longer, the refult of the other Provinces upon the fame fubject is fuddenly expected § as allo upon a Proposition offered to them, that the flanding forces may every year be obliged to draw together in two places upon the Frontiers, there to form a moving Campyand to continue exercifing themfelves for a confiderable patt of the Summer; that for they may be the more ready and fit for lervice, when any occasion may offer it felf for their em-t ployment.

The Prince's Dowager of Orange expects daily the art rival of the Dutcheffes of Frife and Simmeren her Daughsets.

The Heer Bruineux the States Agent at Franchfort, is , ordered to go Refident to the Emperors Court at Vienna, and the Heer Malapart to fupply his room at Franch-, fort.

Here is lately arrived the Baron of Helmont to negotiate about the differences with the Prince of Liege concerning the Caffle of *la Rochete*, formerly feiled by that Prince, pretending to the jurifdiction thereof.

The Heer Van Beuning is lately returned from Frifeland, an i the Heer Roomer from his employment of Refident from the States in the City of Hambourgh.

The 16th inftant arrived here incognito His Highnels the Prince of *Tufcany*, but refueed a Publick Entry and Entertainment, as he has done in the other places of his Travels.
