Rome, July 23. N.S.

Ardinal Grimani has entred a Protest in the Pope's Chancery, against the Pope's granting any Benefices on the King of Spain's Nomination; And at the same time he delivered to the Officers of that Court feveral Copies of the Emperor's Mmifesto, wherein are set torth his Pretentions to the Spanish Succession. The Cardinal Fourhin and the Spanish Ambassador on the other had earnestly press the Pope to grant the Invehicure of the Kingdoms of Naples and Sicily to the King of Spain, but can obtain no Satisfictory Answer. The Pope held lately a Congregation of State, in which 'twas resolved to and a Cardinal with the Character of Legate a Latere to the Emperor, another to the Most Christian King, and a third to the King of Spain, to endeavour to perswade them to an Accommodation. The Imperial Ambassador hd Audience this week of the Pope, and dehiered to him a Letter from the Emperor, to mule his Forces having entred into the Ecclefatical Territories; and affuring him, that as they marched out of the same as soon as the mustify of the Occasion did permit, so he will continue on all Opportunities to express his Regud for the Pope and for his Subjects, and that his Troops shall always, as much as is possible, avoid putting them to any Inconvenience. They wite from Naples, that the Affairs of that Kingdom were in great disorder; and that dires considerable Persons had openly declared for the Emperor, whose Party is so strong, that the Viceroy did not think it tafe to go about to apprehend them.

Venice, July 29. The Senate have made those of Signior Francisco Grimani to be Geretal of their Forces in Dalmatia; and of Signior Nicolo Delfino to be their Ambassador at Fienna, in the room of Signior Londane, who is recalled from that Employment. The Imperial Ambaffedor had Audience lately of the Senate, and affored them, that the Em-Peror his Master would fully satisfie the Subieds of this Republick, for any Damage they may have sustained by the march of the Imperal Forces through this Country; and Coinmissioners have been appointed on both sides to abut this Matter. Letters from Constantinople of the 30th pair fay, an Ambassador from the Cut of Muscowy was arrived at Andrinople with a Retinue of about 100 Persons, and had Audence of the Grand Signior.

Turin, July 30. N.S. The Marriage Contract between the King of Spain and the Princeis of Savoy was figned the 23d Instant. Duke of Savoy went from hence the next day for the Milaneze, to take upon him the Command of the French and Spanish Army, and arrived at Milan about 8 in the evening, where he lay that night, and went the next day to the French Camp. His Royal Highness has left the Administration of the Government to the Dutchels of Savoy; and the Command of the Garrison of this Place, and of all his other Forces in Savoy and Piedmont, to the Marquis de Bagnasco. The Marquis de Castel Rodrigo, Amballador from Spain, has delivered a Prefent from the King his Master to the Princess of Piedmont, confifting of a Jewel and other things to the value of 50000 Crowns. The Ambassador went from hence the 27th to Milan, and will return hither in few days; And the young Prince's will shortly go from hence, accompanied by the faid Amballador and other Perfons of Quality, to Nice, where the Galleys of Naples are ordered to come, to attend her in her Voyage to Barcelona.

Warfaw, July 30. An Officer acrived here 2 days ago, being fent by Field-Marthal Steynau, who commanded the Saxon Forces in Livonia, to give the King an Account of their late Action with the Swedes; He fays, that Count Steyman having received Advice on the 17th Instant, being then at Kockenhausen, that the King of Sweden arrived at Riga two days before; that his Army was come into the Neighbourhood of that Piace; and that Preparations were making for their passing the Duna; he held a Council of War, in which twas relolved to oppole their Passage; Whereupon he went the same day to the Camp of 7 Saxon Regiments, who were potted not far from Riga on the other fide of the River, Icaving Orders with Major-General Robell to follow thither with the rest of the Saxon and Muscovite Forces which were intrenched near Kockenhausen, and with the Artillery; But the 19th, early in the morning, before General Robell could come up, the Swedes passed the Duna, having prepared several flat-bottomed Boats with Batteries, from which they plyed the Saxons very warmly, which obliged them to retire, and to give the Swedes the opportunity to land. The Saxons soon after charged the Swedes, and the Action lasted above 3 hours, and concluded to the disadvantage of the Saxons, who were forced to give way and retire towards Keekenhausen.

This ill Success had so discouraged the Muscovite Auxiliary Forces, that their Officers talked of returning home; and General Steynau not finding himself in a condition to make Head against the Swedes, had sent away his Bagage to Birgen, and intended to retire under the Walis of that Place, and there wait for the King's further Orders. Tis faid, the Saxon Forces suffered very much in this Engagement, having had divers Officers and above 1000 Common Soldiers killed on the Spot, and near 2000 The Negociation for accommodawounded. ting the Differences between the Kings of Sweden and Poland, is carried on with great earnettnets by the Ministers of the several Princes who have offered their Mediation for that pur-The Princes of the House of Sapieba are at Bielsk in Lichuania, and there is at present fome likelihood that Matters may be brought to a friendly Composition between them and the Confederated Nobility of Lithuania. The Cardinal Primate is at present at Lowisz, where he intends to pais the rest of the Summer.

Hamburgh, August 12. N. S. The last Advices from Missaw give an Account, that Major-General Moorner, who commands the Swedish Forces in Garrison there, had caused a Placart to be Published, fetting forth, That it was the King his Mafter's Intention, that none of the Inhabitants of Courland, except such as should result his Forces, should suffer any Prejudice by their entring into that Dutchy; that they had Orders to behave themselves as Friends, and therefore the Subjects of Courland might apply thamselves to their several Employments and Trades, and bring their Wares to the utual Markets, being affured that no Violence should be offered them, but that they should be paid ready Money for any Provisions or other Necellaries furnished by them for the use of the Swedish Forces. The King of Sweden was en-Swedisk Forces. camped with his Army at a place called Eckau, about 5 Miles from Mittaw, and 'twas laid he intended to march against the Saxons, who, after having blown up the Fortifications of Kockenhausen, retired under the Cannon of Birzen in Samogitia; The Muscovites that lately joined them are returned home. The Saxon Garrison in the Dimamunder Fort offered to surrender, provided they might march out with Arms and Bagage, which was refuted; and feeing they can expect no Succour, they must accept of any Terms that will be granted them. Letters from Moscow of the 5th Instant say, the Czar returned thither the 28th past from Woronitz on the River Taneis, where he has his chief Magazines of Naval Stores; And that on the 30th a Fire happened in his Palace, which burnt during to hours with fo much Violence, that the greatest part of the Palace was confumed, and that the Lois was very confiderabie.
