

Hugues's Forces. A Company of Foot of 120 Men of the Forces of *Pad. borne* came yesterday into this Garrison, out of which marched at the same time 2 Companies belonging to the Bishop of *Onubrug*, which are going into the Emperor's Service. The Elector of *Cologne* has lately reinforced the Garrisons of *Bon*, *Keyerswaert*, and *Rhyberg*, with several Companies of his new-raised Forces. The States of the Electorate of *Cologne* are assembled at *Bon*, where the Deputies from the Chapter of this City have complained of the Elector's raising so great a number of Forces without their knowledge and consent, and refuse to enter upon any other Business till they have Satisfaction in this Matter.

*Hamburg, August 26.* Major-General *Haxhausen* arrived here this day from *Copenhagen*, and Field-Marshal General *Guldenlew* is expected from thence in a day or two, and they are forthwith to go to *Sleswy*, to take upon them the Command of the Forces which the King of *Denmark* has lately put into the Emperor's Service. The Danish Forces which are to enter into the Pay of the States-General, have Orders to Rendezvous at *Itzehou*, and Transports are provided at *Wivelsfleth* near the Mouth of the River *Stour* to carry them to *Holland*, and the Horse are to march thither through the Countries of *Lunenburgh* and *Bremen*. 'Tis said, the King of *Denmark* intends to make another Progress to *Holftein* about the beginning of the next month. The Queen Dowager of *Denmark* is expected at *Altona* in 3 or 4 days from *Cassel*. The last Advices from *Courland* say, the *Swedes* are fortifying *Mittaw*, *Bausche*, and other Places in that Country, and that the King of *Sweden's* Army was encamped about a day's march from the Frontiers of *Lithuania*.

*Brussels, August 30.* There are at present 15 Spanish Battalions encamped near this City, and 3 Battalions more, being the rest of the Spanish Foot, are shortly expected; after whose Arrival, the Marquis of *Bismar* will take a General Review of these Forces. The Spanish Horse have Orders to march from the Places where they are cantoned, to Quarters appointed for them in the several Towns. The Burghers of this City are met, to consider of raising the extraordinary Supplies demanded of them. The States of the Electorate of *Cologne* are still assembled at *Bon*, and appear generally dissatisfied with the Conduct of the Elector of *Cologne*, in relation to his Engagement with *France*, and his raising Forces without their Consent; However he continues to make new Levies, and he has put into *Keyerswaert* a Garrison of 1700 Men of his new-raised Forces.

*Leo, August 30.* The Count *de Bentheim*, who came to wait on the King from the Elector *Palatine*, took his leave of His Majesty last Saturday, and returned to *Duffeldorp*. Yesterday morning His Majesty left *Dieren*, and after hunting the Stag, came to this Place in the evening in very good Health.

*Hague, August 30.* The Earl of *Marlborough* went from hence yesterday to review the English Forces at *Breda*, and other Garrisons. The Sieur *Newburgh* and *Julsinga* are gone from hence by order of the Council of State to view the Fortifications and Magazines of the Dutch Towns in *Flanders*. The Sieur *Vander Meur* is appointed to reside on the part of this State at the Court of *Hanover*.

*Paris, August 31.* N. S. Letters from *Milan* of the 20th Instant give an Account, that the French Army was encamped at *Fontanella* and *Ramenengo*, where they would continue till the Arrival of Marshal *Villeroi*, who was daily expected. The Imperialists were encamped at *Palazzuolo* and *Ponte-Ogliso*. Yesterday the Envoy of *Portugal* had a Publick Audience of the King, and of the Prin-

ces and Princesses of the Blood, to make the Compliments of Condolence in his Master's Name upon the Death of the Duke of *Orleans*. Last night the Court went to *Mendon* for 2 or 3 days, and intend to be at *Fountainbleau* the 22d of the next month. Monsieur de *Montargis* is made one of the Treasurers for the extraordinary Charges of the War, and 'tis thought Monsieur *Bernard*, a famous Banker, will be the other; These Places are sold for 1300000 Livres each. The Marquis de *Larvardin*, famous for his Embassy at *Rome* in the time of Pope *Innocent XI.* died some days ago; he was Knight of the Order of the Holy Ghost, and Lieutenant-General of *Britany*. 'Tis said, the Court has Advice, that Marshal *Villeroi* arrived the 23d Instant in the French Camp in *Italy*.
