HE Prince of Vaudement, our Governor, arrived here two days ago from the French Camp near Vrago, and intends shortly to go and view the Fortifications of Fuences, Lecco, and other Places near the Lake de Como. A Re-gment of Foot, and two Regiments of Horfe, king the last of the Auxiliary Forces which the Duke of Savoy is to fend to the Assistance of the frub, arrived here the last week from Picamont,

Two finall Parties of Foot were fent out towards the Enemy's Right Wing, which advanced near their Camp, killed 2 of their advanced Guards, and wounded 4 or 5. Above 20 Deferters, Horse and Foot, came over to us this day. The 18th, the Enemy kept very close in their Camp, so that our Parties that went our returned without meeting any of the Enemy, only a Lieutenant Colonel brought back a French Lieutenant, 2 of the Duke of Savoy's Servants, 15 other Prisoners, and a good Booty of Horses, Mules, and Cattel; And Stragglers were feen near our advanced Guard, & Cornet was fent out with 20 Horfe, who killed about 20 of the Enemy, and took 6 Prisoners.
