Two finall Parties of Foot were fent out towards the Enemy's Right Wing, which advanced near their Camp, killed 2 of their advanced Guards, and wounded 4 or 5. Above 20 Deferters, Horse and Foot, came over to us this day. The 18th, the Enemy kept very close in their Camp, so that our Parties that went our returned without meeting any of the Enemy, only a Lieutenant Colonel brought back a French Lieutenant, 2 of the Duke of Savoy's Servants, 15 other Prisoners, and a good Booty of Horses, Mules, and Cattel; And Stragglers were feen near our advanced Guard, & Cornet was fent out with 20 Horfe, who killed about 20 of the Enemy, and took 6 Prisoners. The 19th, a great number of Wagons inden with Provisions were brought from Romano to cur Magazine at Palazzalo under the Guard of a Pauty of 200 Horse.
