The Duke of Lorrain hastaken Order for ibe reinforcement of his Garrilons upon the Rhine ; and particularly that of Hombourg: that they may be in a positure of defences in cafe the Negociation between the Commissioners about the differences with the Prince Elector Palatine, meets not with that peaceable iffue which is defired ; the faid Duke fee ns willing to give Hombourg and Landfibu I to the faid Elector upon the payment of a confiderable lumme of Moneys; but as concerning the pretentions to Sarwerden and Herbi fheim, he is refelved not to fubmit them to be treated for by the States of the Empire, or to refer them to any arb tration)

A party of the French forces having fome days fince en tred into the Territories of Nomenie in Lorrain, and driven thence fome numbers of Caule, upon complaint ma tes Orders have been fince given for reftitution. The French Troops which were fent towards the three, Bishopricks, are countermanded and ordered to take up their Q intersi part of them in Luxembourg, and the reft in

Burgundy upon the borders of Franche Comte. I he sieur de Rifançourt is lately fent aviey for Vienna by the Duke of Lorrain, about the affairs of the young Prince, which are generally faid to be in a good pofture as to the Election in Poland; in confidence whereof 'tis faid the Emperour has written to the Duke of Lorrain to don4

gratular the great hopes of his fuccels. Thoulon, June 11, he Cartinal de Vendolme having put out to fea with the Fleet defigned for Candia, and accompanied the Duke de ea fort for about 6 Lesgues on board the new great thips called the Grand Monarch; is lately returned up in a Bark, and has taken his way by Aiz on his return for Paris the wind : having much favour'd the Fleet fince their putting out to fea, 'tis hoped they may ete this have gain d as far as 'Maltha.
