

taking into consideration any objections to the draft made in the prescribed manner and within the prescribed time, may make an Order, either in the terms of the draft submitted to him or with such modifications as he thinks fit:

And whereas it appears to the Council of the County of Monmouth to be suitable that the Monmouth Coroner's District of the said County should be abolished and that the existing Districts of Abergavenny and South Monmouthshire should be enlarged:

And whereas the Council of the said County has in pursuance of the said section 12 of the said Act submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order to the aforesaid intent:

And whereas the requirements of the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, have been complied with:

Now therefore I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 12 of the said Act hereby Order that the existing Division of the County of Monmouth into Coroners' Districts shall be altered and that the said Districts shall be named and constituted as set out in the Schedule hereto and substituted for the existing Districts.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, 1946; provided however that nothing herein contained shall affect the proceedings at any inquest begun by a Coroner before that day.
