Order No. 6716.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 31 of 1946.

Subject.

Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Alexandria, Dunbartonshire, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The Area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Ayr, Dunbarton, Lanark, Perth and Kinross, Renfrew and Stirling.
