Delete (including footnote) and substitute the following:—

"2. Every candidate must have been born on or after 2nd August, 1900, and have attained the age of 26 by the 1st January of the year in which he or she competes."

Regulation 4.

"4. Every candidate must be a barrister or admitted solicitor (or, for Scotland, an advocate or qualified solicitor in Scotland)."

Regulation 9.

Delete and substitute the following:—

"9. The Commissioners may summon to appear before a Selection Board all who are found to be *prima facie* eligible, or may, if they see fit, summon only those whose qualifications and experience are considered to be specially suitable. The Selection Board shall have power to give such preference to candidates born on or after 2nd August, 1910, as the Commissioners consider appropriate. Subject to this preference the Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, with due regard to loss of opportunity and to the loss of professional knowledge of those who have served in the Forces, any recommendation from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above facts they will frame their recommendations. The decision of the Commissioners will be final."

5. To make provisions as to the rights, privileges and liabilities of the holders of shares or stock in the capital of the Carmarthen Company and of mortgages and debenture stock of the Carmarthen Company.

6. To extend the limits within which the Carmarthen Company are authorised to supply gas so as to include certain areas (hereinafter referred to as "the added limits") to be defined in the intended order and to provide that the Carmarthen Company shall have and may exercise within the added limits all powers, rights and privileges which they have within their existing limits of supply. To authorise the Carmarthen Company to continue maintain and use any gas mains, pipes and works transferred to or vested in them under the intended Order and to apply to such mains, pipes and works the provisions of the intended Order, and of the Acts incorporated therewith and of the Carmarthen Gas Act and Orders 1870 to 1939.

7. To empower the Carmarthen Company to erect, maintain, alter, improve and renew gas works with all necessary machinery and apparatus, and do all such acts as may be proper for making and storing gas upon lands additional to those now used by the Carmarthen Company for the said purposes and to work up and convert residual products. To alter the maximum price which the Carmarthen Company may charge within their existing limits of supply; to prescribe a new maximum price within the added limits, to empower the Carmarthen Company to charge a differential price or prices in the added areas and to make provision as to the calorific value of the gas to be supplied in the added limits or any part thereof.

8. To empower the Carmarthen Company to acquire additional lands by agreement to make special provision for the benefit of small investors and to enable the Carmarthen Company to issue share capital to their employees and consumers at a fixed price.
