"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Gertrude Isabel Lea and of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly

gazetted Order the estate or interest of the said Gertrude Isabel Lea in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said George, Bishop of Chichester and his successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Bishop and his successors for ever.
