Falmouth, June 17.

The right instant arrived here the Honours-Adventure of London from the Barbadoes p invorming; that leveral French Men of War appear in those Seas p bin have nor sumpred upon any place. The 16th came in here the John of Dartmouth from Croyfick with Salt, intending to put to Sea again with the first fair wind, the Market here not encouraging him to unlade.

Weymouth June 19 Several ships of London and other Ports, which have bent content de Coasts.

The 18th instant prived here the Paradice of London in four weeks from Virginia.

2 Nuples, June 4. From Otranto we are advised, that between that City and Gallipolis the Christians had lavely taken two Turkish prizes, and anade above 80 prisoners.

By the way of Maltha we had Letters from Candia of April 22. assuring us, that the whole force of the Vifier at the stime before the Town exceeded not 20000 ment, and these ingreat want of provisions, and that the Garridon consisted of 12000 stout soldiers, and had great abundance of all Necessaries. They farther advise us that the Squadron of the Maltha Gallies were at Messina, waiting for News of the appearance of the rest of the success wherewith they were to joyn.

Rome, June B. On Monday morning last the Colledge of Cardinals went to a solemn Mass in the Church of Santa Maria d' Ataceli in celebration of a new Holiday in honour of the new admitted St. Pietro d' Alcantara, and for the greater solemnity thereof, the Pope was plased on borseback after dinner to visit the same Church in much state attended by the Princes and Nobility, and was received at the door by Cardinal Chigi:

The Pope continue his refenament of what lately passed in Gonous as to the dismission of his Inquisitor-General; and has ordered an exhoratory Brief to be given to the Generale Resident to be forthwith sent to the Senate, requiring them within 30 days after the receipt thereof, to readmit him to the same power and charge as before, under pain of Excommunication.

Stockholm, June 11. The Chiaux from Tartary is departed hence on his return homewards, but it has not been shought necessary as yer-to-dispatch thither in his company the Sieur Lilienda'e, only one Officer being sent with him, to treat and conclude for the ransome of such Swedes as can be found to be priseners amongst them.

His Excellency the Earl of Cartifle is yet incognite, but is this day intending to go from hence to a place called the Dead sea, to make his Compliments to their Majesties who are there for the present diverting themselves.

Madrid, June 12. It is now confidently teported that all things are at the last fully concluded between the Queen Regent and Don Juan of Austria, on whom the Queen has conferred the Vice-Royalty of Arragon, with the Title of Vicar-General of all that which the King possesses belonging to the Crown of Aragon, and that of Captaint-General by Land and Sea, and the 4th Instance or Order to the Vice-Chancellour of the Council of Arragon, that dispatches should be made in the said Cosneil conformable to this Resolution which hash been accordingly obeyed; and that Don Iuan has written a Letter to the Queen full of Respects and acknowledgements of her savour upon the agreement, but yet still insisting upon his care for the ease of the people from their burdens. His Highness is said to be now preparing to leave Guadalaxara, intending on Monday the 17th instant to depart thence for Saragoge; the place he designs for his Residence; so that now all things are in a peaceable posture, the Queen and the whole Court seeming sintiely satisfyed with the good issue of this affair.

Vienna; June 16. The Count Serini; the Count de Rothal, and the Chancellour of Hungary, are returned hither from Eperies in the Upper Hungary, where the Commissioners appointed no meet there for the satisfaction of Grievances, had agreed, that the Hungarians who upon their own accounts had made the late incursion into Tranfilvania : should be obliged no make a Compensation for the damage (ustained 3 and for other incursions which were made by the Imperial Garrifons, they were contented to remit the confideration thereof to its Imperial Majesty, an Envoye being to be lent from Prince Abaffi 5 to know the Emperburs resolution in this Point The Commissioners also having affired the people of that Kingdom of His Imperial Majesties pleasure that a General Dies shall in little rime be held for the better settlement of all affairs, to their full satisfaction. The Deputies of both Hungaries being ordered to repair bithers, to know His Imperial Majeflies fauther pleasure in several things which are to fall under confideration in order to the General Assembly.

Here is lately arrived a Courier from the Count Schaffgares the Emperous Ambassadour in Poland, confirming kodus the great probability of the good success of the Prince of Lorrain in his pretentions to the Crown of Polands, and that the Election may be finished, in three
