(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be The District (or Parish) of 'Saint Michael and All Angels, Harrow Weald.'

(d) The said district or parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Hampstead and in the rural deanery of Harrow.

RETAIL FOOD TRADES COMMISSION OF INQUIRY.

Notice by the Commission of Inquiry appointed by the Minister of Labour and National Service to inquire into and report on an application made under Section 2 (1) of the Wages Councils Act, 1945, by the Retail Food Trades Joint Industrial Council for the establishment of a Wages Council for certain workers and their employers.

The Minister of Labour and National Service, having appointed the Retail Food Trades Commission of Inquiry in accordance with the Second Schedule to the Wages Councils Act, 1945, has referred to it en application made to him by the Retail Food Trades Joint Industrial Council under Section 2 of the Act for the establishment of a wages council in respect of the workers specified in the council in respect of the workers specified in the Schedule to this Notice and their employers, on the ground that the existing machinery for the settlement of remuneration and conditions of employment for the said workers is likely to cease to be adequate for that purpose and is likely to cease to exist.

In considering whether any machinery is or is likely to remain adequate for regulating the remuneration and conditions of employment of any exploration and conditions of employment of any

workers the Commission is required by Section 4 of the Act to consider not only what matters are capable of being dealt with by that trachinery but also to what extent those matters are covered by agreements or awards arrived at or given there-under and to what extent the practice is or is likely to be in accordance with those agreements or

awards.
