At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 4th day of *June*, 1946.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by Section 8 of the Weights and Measures Act, 1878 (41 and 42 Vic. c. 49) it is provided that the Board of Trade shall, from time to time, cause such new Denominations of Standards, being either equivalent to or multiples or aliquot parts of the Imperial Weights and Measures ascertained by the said Act as appear to them to be required, in addition to those mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act, to be made and duly verified, and that those new Denominations of Standards, when approved by His Majesty in Council, shall be Board of Trade Standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the said schedule:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Board of Trade that a new Denomination of Standard Weight of 0.025 ounce troy, that is to say one-fortieth of an ounce troy, being an aliquot part of the Imperial Weight of an ounce troy ascertained by the said Act, is required, and they have caused the same to be made and duly verified:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Act, and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve the Weight of 0.025 ounce troy as a new Denomination of Standard, and doth direct that the same shall be a Board of Trade Standard in like manner as if it were mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Weights and Measures Act, 1878.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of May, 1946, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parish of All Saints, Harrow Weald and of the parish of Holy Trinity, Wealdstone, both in the diocese of London, and for constituting parts of those parishes so altered a new parish:

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, are satisfied (1) that it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said parish of All Saints, Harrow Weald and of the said parish

of Holy Trinity, Wealdstone in the manner described in Part I of the Schedule and delineated on the map marked 'A' annexed to this Scheme and thereon coloured green; and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the map marked 'B' hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink and blue would be best served by constituting the said area a new parish and that a suitable endowment thereof will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"And whereas all the requirements of the said New Parishes Measure in respect of notices and consents to this Scheme have been complied with:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend and Right Honourable William, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. As from the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the boundaries of the said parish of All Saints, Harrow Weald, and of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Wealdstone, shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map marked 'A.'

"2. (a) As from the licence of the Minister first licensed thereto subsequently to the date aforesaid, the area (being parts of the parishes so altered as aforesaid) defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map marked 'B,' shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us as suitable to be the parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be The District (or Parish) of 'Saint Michael and All Angels, Harrow Weald.'

(d) The said district or parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Hampstead and in the rural deanery of Harrow.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"Part I.

"The territory shown by the green colour on the map hereto to be annexed to the parish of Holy Trinity, Wealdstone, in the said diocese comprising:—

(1) All that portion of the said parish of All Saints, Harrow Weald, which is bounded upon the east by the parish of Saint Anselm, Belmont, upon the south-west by the parish of Saint John the Baptist, Greenhill, upon the west by the said parish of Holy Trinity, Wealdstone, and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing at a point opposite to
