Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

And whereas the Bishop of the diocese consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parish of Saint Giles, Durham, and of the said parish of Belmont shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

THE SCHEDULE TO WHICH THE FOREGOING SCHEME HAS REFERENCE.

The territory (shewn by the pink colour on the map) to be annexed to the said parish of Saint Giles, Durham:—

All that portion of the said parish of Belmont bounded on the north-east by the parish of Sherburn, on the south by the parish of Shincliffe, on the west by the said parish of Saint Giles, Durham, and on the north, on the east, and on the north-east by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary dividing the said parish of Saint Giles, Durham, from the said parish of Belmont at the centre point of the junction of Mill Lane and Renny's Lane and extending thence eastwards along the middle of Renny's Lane to the centre of the junction of that Lane with Dragon Lane and extending thence southwards along the middle of the last-mentioned Lane to its junction with Front Street and extending thence to and along the middle of the last-mentioned street to the boundary which divides the said parish of Belmont from the said parish of Sherburn.

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of June, 1946, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme with respect to two of the rural deaneries within the Archdeaconry of Ipswich, and in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, that the arrangements, which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to two of the rural deaneries within the said Archdeaconry, are desirable and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the parishes or cures of Raydon with Shelly; Holton St. Mary with Great Wenham; Hintlesham with Chattisham; Higham; and Stratford St. Mary, shall be transferred from the rural deanery of Samford in the said Archdeaconry of Ipswich to the rural deanery of Hadleigh in the

same Archdeaconry, and each of the parishes or cures transferred as hereinbefore mentioned shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the rural dean of the rural deanery to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other rural dean.

And whereas the provisions of the said Acts relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of June, 1946, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cures (hereinafter called the said benefice) of Otham with St. John the Evangelist, Maidstone, in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury.

Whereas we are satisfied that The President and Scholars of the College of St. Mary Magdalen, in the University of Oxford (hereinafter called "the said President and Scholars") are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant:

And whereas the said President and Scholars desire to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to the same):

And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Geoffrey Francis, Archbishop of Canterbury and his successors in the same Archbishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.
