SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.

THE WAKEFIELD CORPORATION ACT, 1938 (EXTENSION OF TIME) ORDER, 1946.

UNDER the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940, the Minister of Transport has made an Order extending for a period of three years the time limited by section 6 of the Wakefield Corporation Act, 1938, as extended by the Wakefield Corporation Act, 1938 (Extension of Time) Order, 1943, for the compulsory acquisition authorised by section 5 of the Act of 1938 of the lands required for the purposes of street improvements.
