**O**UR Vice-Roy being informed, that Prince Eugene intends to send a Detachment of Imperial Forces to this Kingdom, he has caused most of the Forces lately arrived here from Spain and the Milanese to march to the Province of Abruzzo, as well to secure those Frontiers, as to awe the Inhabitants, who are generally suspected of being in the Emperor's Interest, many of which are the Friends and Vassals of the Marquis del Vasto, whose Estate has been lately confiscated upon a like suspicion. A Regiment of dismounted Troopers is coming hither from Milan, and farther Succours are laid to be on their way from Catalonia: Count d'Estrees has received Orders to return to Toulon with the Squadron of French Men of War under his Command. Cardinal Giudice went from hence this week to Sicily, being appointed to be Governor of that Kingdom till a Vice-Roy is sent thither, and the Duke of Escalona is shortly expected from thence, to take upon him the Administration of this Government, in the room of the Duke of Medina Celi, our Vice-Roy, who being made President of the Council of the Indies, is going to Madrid to exercise that Office. The Marquis of Grigni is expected in few days from Spain, to take Possession of the Employment of Governor of the Arms in this Kingdom.

**Warsaw, January 12.** The Commissioners appointed by the King of Poland for adjusting the Differences between the House of Sapielka and the Confederated Nobility of Lithuania, have made such Progress in this Affair, that the latter are brought to consent to the restoring of Prince Sapielka and those of his Party to their Estates and Dignities; insisting only that the Office of Lieutenant-General of Lithuania, which is now vacant, may be conferred upon the young Prince Wisnouijsky, and that some other Regulations may be made which they think absolutely necessary to secure them from the Resentment of the House of Sapielka; so that 'tis probable this Matter will be soon brought to a good Conclusion. The Diet have deferred proceeding to the Choice of a Marshal, and entering upon Business, till this Negotiation be finished; and the King having, by several Messages, pressed them to consider of providing for the Publick Security, and represented to them how the Swedish Forces are advanced into Lithuania, the Diet has assured him, That nothing should be wanting in them that may conduce to the Security of his Person, or the Republick. Count Straatman, the Emperor's Minister, having received a Commission from Vienna to take upon him the Character of Ambassador, had Publick Audience of the King this week: He continues his Endeavours for adjusting Matters between the Kings of Sweden and Poland, and not without good hopes of Success.

*From the King of Sweden's Head Quarters at Wargen in Courland, January 14.* The King returned to this Place in very good Health the 10th Instant from Lithuania, having in several Rencounters defeated the Sieur Oginsky and his Party. The King has resolved to remove his Head Quarters from this Place to Goldingen, and to canton part of his Army in and about that Town, and send the rest to join the Swedish Detachment in Lithuania, and accordingly Orders are given to the Swedish Forces to be in a readiness to march by the 17th Instant.

**Vienna, Jan. 14.** The new Levies in the Emperor's Hereditary Dominions, for recruiting and augmenting his Forces, are carried on with very good success. It continues to be said at Court, That the King of the Romans will Command the Army on the Rhine, and under him Prince Lewis of Baden, who is shortly expected here to assist at a great Council of War, for settling the Measures to be taken the next Campaign. Several Regiments which were quartered in Hungary and Transilvania are marching to Bohemia, from whence they are to proceed early in the Spring to the Upper-Rhine. A considerable Reinforcement will be sent to Italy, where the French seem resolved to use their utmost Efforts, notwithstanding the little Encouragement they have from the Success of the last Campaign.

**Dresden, Jan. 17.** The King of Poland has sent Orders to his Council of State here, to publish a Placart, requiring all his Subjects who are in the Service of any Foreign Prince to quit the same, with Promise of granting them Employments equal to those they enjoy abroad. Count Pfeulingen, Chancellor of the Electorate of Saxony, has received from Vienna an Instrument, by which the Emperor confers upon him the Dignity of a Count of the Empire. They write from Warsaw, that Count Straatman, the Emperor's Minister there, has received a Commission to take upon him the Character of Imperial Ambassador, and that he continues, with other Foreign Ministers there, to endeavour an Accommodation of the Differences between the Kings of Sweden and Poland, and the Czar of Muscovy, which 'tis hoped may be affected this Winter.

**Cologne, Jan. 24.** The Deputies from the Directors of the Circle of Westphalia continue their Conferences about providing for the farther Security of this Place; They are working with great Application to repair and augment our Fortifications. A good number of Pioneers are employed in fortifying Sigeberg, and this Work is already in good forwardness.
