ARTICLE 19.

Agreement of Foster Parent.

- (a) I will receive C.D. into my home, and feed, clothe and look after him and bring him up as carefully and kindly as I would a child of my own;
- (b) I will help him become a good citizen, send him to school\* work\* and to his church\* chapel\* and arrange for recreation suited to his age;

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under Section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be:

(a) To provide for the construction by the Minister of a new road from a point on the Elveden-Bury St. Edmunds Road (B.1106), approximately 84 yards south-east of its junction with the London-Norwich Trunk Road (A.11) at Elveden in the County of Suffolk to a point on the said Trunk Road approximately 28 yards south-west of the said junction;

(b) to provide for the stopping up entirely of the existing junction between the Elveden-Bury St. Edmunds Road and the said Trunk Road on its south-eastern side when the new road is completed;

(c) that section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1936 (which modifies the Restriction of Ribbon Development Act, 1935, in its application to trunk roads), will apply to the new road on the date when the Order comes into force;

(d) that the West Suffolk County Council will become the highway authority for the new road on the first day of April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new road is opened for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Order and the plan showing the line of the new road may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period of three months from December 19th, 1946, at the offices of the Ministry of Transport, Mayfair Court, Stratton Street, London, W.1, or at the offices of the West Suffolk County Council, Shire Hall, Bury St. Edmunds, or at the West Suffolk County Council Divisional Surveyor's Office, Mildenhall, or at the offices of the Divisional Road Engineer, Palace Chambers, Silver Street, Bedford.

Any person may within the said period of three months from December 19th, 1946, object to the making of the Order by notice to the Minister addressed to Mayfair Court, Stratton Street, London, W.1.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be that a new road which he proposes to construct near Ailsworth and Castor in the County of the Soke of Peterborough will become a trunk road on the date when the Order comes into force in substitution for a length of approximately 2½ miles of the Birmingham-Great Yarmouth Trunk Road which passes through Castor, and the length of the said Trunk Road superseded thereby will cease to be a trunk road on the first day of April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Soke of Peterborough County Council (who will thereafter become the highway authority responsible for that road) that the new road is opened for through traffic.
