Hereas by Our Royal Proclemation, Dated at Our Genet at Kenington the Eighth Day of Jamany last, for the giving as due Encouragement to all such Seamer and Able-Bodied Ludwar, who should voluntarily Enter themselves in Our Strike, and Remain on Board Our Ships of War is Our Ryal Navy, We did Promps and Declare, That all such Samen and Able-Bodied Landmen, who either since the Ensure of January last had Entred, or should by the Esteuath Day of this bestimen February voluntarily Enter steaselves and Remain on Board any of our Skips of War in the Ensure of Strike Ships or Tenders belonging to Our Fleet, and Resilve and Remain on Roard any of our Skips of War in the Ensure Allowances and Remains following, (viz.) Libau, Febr. 7. The King of Sweden is gone from his Quarters at Goldingen to Lithuania, to Command his Forces in Person, which are on their march towards Poland. The Swedish Forces which were quartered here are all marched away except one Regiment of Foot. Letters from Liefland say, a Party of 200 Muscovites came to plunder a small Village on the Frontiers of that Province; but the Inhabitants got together to the number of about

bitants got together to the number of about 30 or 40, and obliged them to retire, having killed feveral, and taken some Prisoners.

Dantzick, Febr. 11. An Express arrived here yefferday from Winfaw, which brings an Account, that the General Diet of Poland broke up the 7th instant through the Means of one of the Deputies, who protested against their Proceedings, and departed out of the Assimbly. 'Fis said a Diet will meet on Horseback; and that the King of Poland intends shortly to take a Journey to Saxony. nev to Sammy.
