GEORGE THE SIXTH by the Grace of God of Great Britain Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas KING Defender of the Faith Emperor of India To all Archbishops Dukes Marquesses Earls Viscounts Bishops Barons Baronets Knights Citizens and Burgesses and all other Our faithful Subjects whatsover to whom these Presents shall come Greeting WHEREAS by section six of an Act passed in the first year of Our Reign intituled "The Regency Act 1937" it is amongst other things enacted that in the event of Our absence or intended absence from Our United Kingdom We may in order to prevent delay or difficulty in the despatch of public business by Letters Patent under the Great Seal delegate for the period of that absence to Counsellors of State such of the Royal functions as may subject to the exceptions provided in the said Act be specified in the Letters Patent AND WHEREAS it is Our intention to be absent from Our United Kingdom for the purpose of visiting Our Union of South Africa Our Colony of Southern Rhodesia and other territories in Africa forming parts of Our dominions or under Our protection AND WHEREAS the persons to whom Royal functions may by virtue of the said section as amended by an Act passed in the seventh year of Our Reign intituled "The Regency Act 1943" now be delegated by Us as Counsellors of State are Our Most dearly beloved Consort The Queen Our Most dearly beloved Daughter Her Royal Highness Princess Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Our Most dear and entirely beloved Brother and Most faithful Counsellor His Royal Highness Prince Henry William Frederick Albert Duke of Gloucester Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter Knight of Our Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle Knight of Our Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick Great Master and Principal Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Knight Grand Cross

of the Royal Victorian Order Our Most dear and entirely beloved Sister Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal Victoria Alexandra Alice Mary Dame Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order Dame Grand Cross of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire Lady of the Imperial Order of the Crown of India and Our Most dear and entirely beloved Nephew George Henry Hubert Lascelles (commonly called Viscount Lascelles) AND WHEREAS Our Consort The Queen and The Princess Elizabeth intend to accompany Us during Our intended absence from the United Kingdom KNOW YE that We do hereby by virtue of the provisions of the said Acts except from among the number of Counsellors of State during the period of Our absence Our Consort The Queen and The Princess Elizabeth and delegate for that period to the following Counsellors of State that it is to say to The Duke of Gloucester The Princess Royal and Viscount Lascelles the Royal functions hereinafter specified to be exercised jointly by not less than two of their number subject to the condition that they shall not act in any matter or thing on which it is signified by Us or appears to them that Our special approval should previously be obtained and accordingly We do by these Presents delegate and grant unto the said Counsellors of State or any two of them full power and authority during the period of Our said absence to summon and hold on Our behalf Our Privy Council and to signify thereat Our approval of any matter or thing to which Our approval in Council is required and further to approve and sign on Our behalf commissions for signifying the Royal Assent to Acts of Parliament except an Act touching any of the matters for which provision is made in the Act of Settlement or touching Our Royal Style and Titles and to approve and sign on Our behalf any proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document requiring Our Signature which relates to the affairs of Our United Kingdom India Burma or any of Our Colonies or any Territories under Our protection or in which We have jurisdic-tion other than Colonies and Territories administered by Our Government in any Dominion within the meaning of the Statute of

Westminster 1931 and to do on Our behalf any matter or thing required to be done in relation to any such proclamation warrant fiat submission or other document and further to do on Our behalf any matter or thing which by virtue of Our Royal Prerogative or of any statutory or other power We are authorised to do for the safety or good government of Our United Kingdom India Burma any of Our said Colonies or any of the said Territories save only that as provided in the said Act they the said Counsellors of State shall not have power to dissolve Parliament otherwise than on Our express instructions transmitted by Us and shall not grant any rank title or dignity of the peerage and further that they shall not receive any homage required to be done to Ourself and shall not approve and sign any warrant submission or other document set out in the Schedule hereunto annexed Commanding all and singular Archbishops Dukes Marquesses Earls Viscounts Bishops Barons Baronets Knights Citizens and Baronets Knights Citizens Burgesses and all other Our Officers Ministers and Subjects that in everything appertaining to the matters aforesaid they be attendant counselling and helping the said Counsellors of State as it behoves them.

(Application for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934.)

THE Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wallingford (hereinafter respectively referred to as "the Corporation" and "the borough") whose address is 34, High Street, Wallingford, Berks, are applying to the Minister of Fuel and Power for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934 for the following objects: objects:

To extend the limits of the Corporation for the supply of gas so as to include the area in which the South Oxfordshire Water and Gas Company is supplying gas (hereinafter respectively referred to as "the Company" and "the Company's Gas area") and an additional area (hereinafter referred to as "the additional area") and to prescribe the respective dates on which such extensions shall take effect. 2. To provide for the sale and transfer to the Corporation of the gas undertakings of the Company except the site of the gasworks and gasholder of the Company and the buildings and plant erected thereon (other than the gasholder) and except certain other assets of the Company's gas undertaking.

- 3. To prescribe the consideration to be paid by the Corporation to the Company for the sale and transfer to the Corporation of the Company's gas undertaking other than the excepted portions thereof and to prescribe the date on which such sale and transfer shall take effect (hereinafter referred to as "the date of vesting").
- 4. To make provision with respect to the debts liabilities and outgoings of, and the moneys due or accruing due to, the Company in relation to their gas undertaking and the payment and recovery thereof respectively.
- 5. To empower the Corporation (i) in the Company's gas area on and after the date of vesting and (ii) in the additional area on and after the date on which it is added to the Corporation's gas limits to have and exercise such of the powers rights privileges and authorities which they have and may exercise within their existing gas limits as the Order exercise within their existing gas limits as the Order may provide, and also to empower the Corporation on and after the date of vesting to continue maintain and use any mains pipes and other works of the Company which are in the Company's gas area and are transferred to the Corporation pursuant to the Order and to extend and apply to such mains pipes and works the provisions of the Wallingford Gas Orders 1899 to 1941 and of the intended Order with such exceptions and modifications (if any) as may be defined in the Order.
- 6. To empower the Corporation before the date of vesting to break up, and lay down and place mains pipes and other works in the following

In the borough—Croft Road, St. John's Road, and Reading Road.

In the rural district of Wallingford—the roads leading from Wallingford to Streatley and Cholsey respectively, the roads known as Caps Lane and Papist Way in the parish of Cholsey and the road leading from the Oxford-Reading road (A 329) to Greenlands Farm in the parish of Moulsford.

In the rural district of Bradfield—the road leading from Streatley to Goring.

In the rural district of Henley—the road leading from Goring to Crowmarsh and the road therefrom to the Company's gasholder.

- 7. To make provision with respect to gas supplied to consumers in the Company's gas area before and after the reading of the meter indices for the quarter terminating on or immediately preceding the date of vesting.
- 8. To authorise the Corporation to use for the storage of gas the land constituting the site of the Company's gasholder. A description of the said land may be inspected on or before the 28th day

- ro. To prescribe the calorific value of gas supplied by the Corporation in the added limits and to make provision with respect to the adjustment of consumers' burners in the Company's gas area.
- 11. To prescribe the maximum price for gas supplied by the Corporation in the added limits and to provide for the revision thereof; to authorise the Corporation to charge differential prices for gas in the added limits; to prescribe the charges for the hire of prepayment meters and fittings within the Corporation's existing gas limits and the added limits.
- 12. To empower the Corporation to purchase and sell liquid butane, liquid propane and similar liquids and to use such liquids for the enrichment of gas.
- 13. To confer further powers on the Corporation with respect to the laying of pipes and other works in streets not dedicated to public use and to empower the Corporation to lay mains pipes and culverts for ancillary purposes and to break up streets for that purpose. purpose.
- 14. To empower the Corporation to borrow money for paying any sum payable to the Company in

respect of the said sale and transfer of the Company's gas undertaking and for other purposes of the intended Order and of the Corporation's gas undertaking.

15. To provide that as from the date of vesting the Company shall be incorporated for the purposes the Company shall be incorporated for the purposes only of supplying water and carrying on their water undertaking; to repeal the provisions of the South Oxfordshire Water and Gas Acts and Orders 1905 to 1946 so far as they relate to the Company's gas undertaking; to change the name of the Company on the date of vesting and to make provision for and with respect to the realisation and distribution of the assets of the Company's gas undertaking which are not transferred to and vested in the Corporation pursuant to the intended Order and the distribution of any sum of money paid to the Comdistribution of any sum of money paid to the Com-pany in respect of the said sale and transfer of their gas undertaking.

16. To sanction and confirm any agreement between the Corporation and the Company with respect to the subject matters of this Notice.

17.
