WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1945.

RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING WAGES COUNCIL (ENGLAND AND WALES).

The Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (England and Wales) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals (1) for the revocation of Order R.B. (E. & W.) 12 dated 4th December, 1936, as amended by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation Order, 1946 (R.B. (E. & W.) 24) and for the substitution of statutory minimum remuneration for the minimum rates of wages at present in operation, and (2) for the revocation of Order R.B. (E. & W.) 16, dated 15th July, 1940, and for the making of a Wages Regulation Order for holidays and holiday remuneration in substitution for the provisions at present in operation.
