Tis said, a new Rokotz or Confederation is on foot among the Nobility of Poland. In the mean time we bear from Lithuania, that the Swedish Army is entred into that Dutchy, and that 'tis given out they are marching hither; and there being no Forces at hand to refift them, the King of Poland has resolved to retire to Cracon, and has already sent to that City the Train of Artillery, and all the Ammunition which were here, and has dispatched Orders for his Forces to march thither from Saxony.

Danuzitk, Febr. 22. Letters from Warfaw of the 17th Instant say, the King of Poland having summoned the Senate to meet, to consider what is proper to be done in the present Conjuncture, they sate for the first time the 16th. The King has resolved to retire to Cracow, and has dispatched Orders to Prince Furstenberg, who in his Absence has the Administration of Assairs in Saxony, to send what Troops he can to his Assistance.
