

" And whereas the Bishop of the diocese consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that, from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the boundaries of the said parishes shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

" *The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.*

" The territory (shown by the pink colour on the map) to be annexed to the said parish of Newbold upon Avon:—

" All that portion of the said parish of New Bilton which is bounded upon the West, the North, and the North East by the said parish of Newbold upon Avon; upon the East by the parish of Rugby (St. Andrew) and upon the remaining sides, that is to say upon the South and the South West by an imaginary line commencing at a point where the main line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway from Rugby to Nuneaton crosses the boundary which divides the said parish of Rugby (St. Andrew) from the said parish of New Bilton and extending thence in a North Westerly direction along the Northern embankment of the said railway to its junction with the boundary which divides the said parish of New Bilton from the said parish of Newbold upon Avon."

" And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

" And whereas the said Scheme has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Letters Patent:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester and Viscount Lascelles being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf ratify the said Scheme and order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

WHEREAS His Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 and 1943, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 24th day of January, 1947, to delegate and grant unto His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.M.B., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, G.C.V.O., G.B.E., C.I., and Viscount Lascelles, or any two of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of February 1947, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her

said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Kirk Leatham in the county and diocese of York:

" Whereas we are satisfied that Kathleen Teresa Turner Le Roy Lewis of Kirk Leatham aforesaid, Widow, is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant:

" And whereas the said Kathleen Teresa Turner Le Roy Lewis desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Archbishop of York for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

" And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Cyril, Archbishop of York and his successors in the same Archbishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may, from time to time, be exercised by the Archbishop of York for the time being."
