3. To modify the provisions of Sections 4 and 9 of the Dursley Gas Order, 1922, so as to authorise the Company to raise the said share capital for the purposes of the said undertaking and to borrow the said sum or sums and charge the same on the said undertaking and so far as may be necessary to give full effect to the proposed Order to incorporate or apply, with or without modification, or to repeal, alter or amend any other provisions of the Dursley Gas Orders, 1888 to 1934, or any Act or any other Order.

4. Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the said Minister any objection to the application may do so by registered letter addressed to the said Minister and despatched on or before the 5th day of April, 1947.

5. Any such objection must state the specific grounds of objection and a copy of the objection must be forwarded to the Company, or to the undermentioned Parliamentary Agents, at the same time as it is despatched to the said Minister.

CATERHAM AND WARLINGHAM PLANNING SCHEME.

NOTICE is hereby given that: 1. On the 4th day of March 1947 the Urban District Council of Caterham and Warlingham (hereinafter called the Council) passed a Resolution deciding to prepare a

Scheme varying the above mentioned Planning Scheme in respect of an area situate wholly within the Urban District of Caterham and Warlingham.

2. The Map defining the area to which the Resolution applies has been deposited at the Council Offices, Harestone Valley Road, Caterham, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, both days inclusive.

3. Any person who is or claims to be an owner of any property in the area and any Association representing owners of property within the said Urban District and any local Association representing business or industry may, unless already done by notice in writing specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Council to register without charge his or their names and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to this Scheme.

The Council intend in due course to ask the Minister to make an Order under Section 33 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, suspending the provisions of the existing Scheme, with the result that the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Acts, 1932 and 1943, with respect to the Control of Interim Development shall as from the date upon which the Order becomes operative and is duly registered in the Register of Local Land Charges, apply to development to which the Order relates.

The Council intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a draft Scheme, and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Clerk to the Council.

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated:—Cattle plague or rinder-pest (*pestis-bovina*), 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*), 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovinum*), 1850; rabies, 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*), 1906; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*), 1928. Dourine (*exanthema coitale paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.
