(iii) Candidates appointed as Established Typists in the Civil Service from an Open Competition, who were under 17 years of age on the governing date for age for that Competition, may be admitted to the examination provided that they have conto the examination, provided that they have continued to be employed in the Established Typing Grades of the Civil Service up to the first day of the examination, and that they are under the
