

**SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.**

**BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL.**

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool (hereinafter called "the Corporation") made application to the Minister of Health (hereinafter called "the Minister") for the issue of an Order under the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1940") to extend by three years the time limited by:—

(a) Section 7 of the Blackpool Improvement Act, 1935, as extended by Section 14 of the Blackpool Improvement Act, 1938, for the compulsory purchase of the lands which the Corporation are authorised to acquire for the purposes set out in paragraph (e) of Subsection (1) of Section 5 of the said Act of 1935, and,

(b) Section 13 of the Blackpool Improvement Act, 1938, for the compulsory purchase of the lands which the Corporation are authorised to acquire for the purposes set out in subsection (1) of Section 5 of that Act, other than for the purposes of the street improvements authorised by the Act; And whereas the Minister by the Blackpool (Extension of Time) Order, 1944, extended each of the said times by three years, that is to say, until the thirty-first day of December, 1947;

And whereas the Corporation have made application to the Minister for an Order under the Act of 1940 to extend by three years the time as now limited for the purchase of the lands referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) respectively above, that is to say until the thirty-first day of December, 1950;

Notice is hereby given that the Minister will consider any objections or representations made to him in writing against the grant of the said application before the second day of June, 1947, by any person or body interested in the subject-matter of the application. Such objections or representations should be addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Health, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, and copies of them should at the same time be sent to the Town Clerk, Town Hall, Blackpool, Lancashire.
