Civil Service Commission.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, Clause 12 of the General Regulations respecting appointments to His Majesty's Civil Establishments, made under the Order in Council of the 22nd July, 1920, and published in the London Gazette of the 6th April, 1923, has been amended to read as follows, viz.:—

12. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for appointment to the Foreign Office or services under the control of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, or to the Admiralty, War Office, Air Ministry, Ministry of Supply or Ministry of Defence, unless he is a natural born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, or parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he may be admitted to appointment or competition by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the First Lord of the Admiralty, the Secretary of State for War, the Secretary of State for Air, the Minister of Supply or the Minister of Defence, as the case may be.

CITY AND COUNTY OF KINGSTON UPON HULL.

SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.

Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County of Kingston upon Hull (hereinafter called "the Corporation") made application to the Minister of Health (hereinafter called "the Minister") for the issue of an Order under the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1940") to extend until the 12th March, 1950, the time limited by the Kingston upon Hull (Jenning Street) Housing Confirmation Order 1939 for the compulsory purchase of the lands specified in the Schedule thereto;

And whereas the Minister by the Kingston upon Hull (Extension of Time) Order, 1945, extended the said time by three years;

And whereas the Corporation have made application to the Minister for an Order under the Act of 1940 to extend the time as now limited for the purchase of the said lands until the 12th March, 1950;

Notice is hereby given that the Minister will consider any objections or representations made to him in writing before the second day of June 1947, by any person or body interested in the application.
