# Crown Office, House of Lords. 19th June, 1947.

The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal to present The Reverend Joseph Ernest Williams M.A., Hon. ### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th June, 1947, at I p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

amount of £170,000,000. 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 30th June, 1947, to Saturday, the 5th July, 1947, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date. 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

of England. 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than  $f_{50,000}$  and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker. 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will

be informed of the same not later than the following be informed of the same not later than the following day and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of. England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than r.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not

precluded from tendering for these Bills. 8. Tenders must be made or the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England. 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's

1947, directing that as from the 30th June, 1947, purchase tax shall be chargeable on road vehicles (whether mechanically propelled or not) having, to the rear of the driver's seat, roofed accommoda-tion lit by side windows and fitted with, or con-structed or adapted for the fitting of, seating for passengers, not being transcars, trolley vehicles, omnibuses and charabancs, ambulances, invalid carriages and perambulators

to make the following explanations: --Foreign Service Regulations Nos. I, 12-16 and 18-21, which were published in the London Gazette of 14th January, 1947, are General Regulations ap-plicable (unless otherwise stated) to all Branches of the Foreign Service. These regulations have been re-numbered consecutively 1-10 and now form Chapter 1 of the Foreign Service Regulations. The remainder of the Regulations published on 14th January, 1947, have been re-numbered 1-11 and form Chapter II of the Foreign Service Regula-tions. Chapter II applies to Branch A of the Foreign Service.

# CHAPTER III.

### BRANCH B.

## **REGULATION No. 1.**

GRADES AND SALARIES.

1. The grades and salaries of members of Branch B of the Foreign Service are:—
