

BRISTOL WATERWORKS COMPANY.

SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.

Whereas the Bristol Waterworks Company (hereinafter called "the Company") made application to the Minister of Health (hereinafter called "the Minister") for the issue of an Order under the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1940") to extend by three years the time limited by section 30 of the Bristol Waterworks Act, 1939, for the compulsory purchase of the lands and easements which the Company are by that Act authorised to acquire;

And whereas the Minister by the Bristol Waterworks (Extension of Time) Order, 1945, extended the said time until the 31st day of October, 1948;

And whereas the Company have made application to the Minister for an Order under the Act of 1940 to extend by a further three years the time as now limited for the purchase of the said lands and easements, that is to say, until the 31st day of October, 1951;

And whereas the Company have also made application to the Minister for an Order under the Act of 1940 to extend by three years the time limited by section 12 of the Bristol Waterworks Act, 1939, for the completion of the waterworks authorised by section 9 of that Act to be constructed, that is to say, until the 28th day of July, 1952;

Notice is hereby given that the Minister will consider any objection or representation made to him in writing against the grant of the said application before the 11th day of August, 1947, by any person or body interested in the subject-matter thereof. TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under Section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be:

(a) To provide for the construction by the Minister of a new road from a point on the Roboston

Wathen-Narberth road (B.4314) approximately 40 yards south-east of its junction with the London-Fishguard Trunk Road near Roboston Wathen in the County of Pembroke in a general northerly direction to a point on the said Trunk Road approximately 30 yards east of the said junction;

(b) to provide for the stopping up entirely of the existing junction between the Roboston Wathen-Narberth road and the said Trunk Road when the new road has been completed;

(c) that section 4 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1936, (which modifies the Restriction of Ribbon Development Act, 1935, in its application to trunk roads), will apply to the new road on the date when the Order comes into force;

(d) that the Pembrokeshire County Council will become the highway authority for the new road on the first day of April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the new road is opened for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Order and the plan showing the line of the new road may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours during a period of three months from 24th July, 1947, at the offices of the Ministry of Transport, Berkeley Square House, London, W.1, or at the offices of the Pembrokeshire County Council, County Offices, Haverfordwest, or at the offices of the Divisional Surveyor, Narberth, or at the offices of the Divisional Road Engineer, Graham Buildings, Newport Road, Cardiff.

Any person may within the said period of three months from 24th July, 1947, object to the making of the Order by notice to the Minister addressed to Berkeley Square House, London, W.1.

1. Contracts, as from 17th July, 1947, the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Llanblethian, Cowbridge, Glamorgan, declared by Order No. 6857 and extended by Order No. 6866, to an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 5 miles of St. Nicholas, Cardiff, Glamorgan.

2. Releases such contracted Infected Area from restrictions on 24th July, 1947.
