"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Beckenham, in the diocese of Rochester for the patronage of the benefice of Saint Mary, Hoo, in the same diocese:

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Beckenham, is vested in the Bishop of Rochester for the time being:

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hoo, is vested in Sir Ambrose Elton, Baronet, of Clevedon Court, in the county of Somerset, Charles Alexander Buckmaster, J.P., of 16, Heathfield Road, Acton, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, George Hope Stevenson, a Fellow of University College, Oxford, and Lawrence Elmore Jones, of 68, Coleman Street, in the City of London, Solicitor, the present Trustees of the Society for the Maintenance of the Faith (hereinafter called 'the trustees'):

"And whereas it has been proposed to us that the patronage of the said two benefices should be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester, and the Trustees (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Beckenham, shall be transferred to the trustees and shall thenceforth be absolutely wested in and shall from time to time be exercised by the trustees and their successors for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hoo, shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be transferred to the said Christopher, Bishop of Rochester, and his successors and shall thenceforth be absolutely vested in and shall from time to time be exercised by the said Christopher, Bishop of Rochester, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.
