LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport after the expiry of at least 40 days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 10 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, to make Regulations for the purpose of continuing at Kingsland Passage, Hackney, the one-way traffic working which is at present in force by virtue of the Regulation of Traffic (London Traffic Area) (No. 2) Order, 1943 (Item No. 17 of the Schedule thereto). (S.R. & O. 1943 No. 1329.)

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport, after the expiry of at least 40 days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 10 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, to make Regulations for the purpose of prohibiting slow-moving traffic (i.e. motor vehicles subject to a speed limit of 5 miles per hour, horse-drawn vehicles, and vehicles propelled by hand) from using Blackwall Tunnel and Rotherhithe Tunnel at all times, and to revoke the London Traffic (Prohibition of Slow-Moving Vehicles) (Blackwall Tunnel) Regulations, 1939, which prohibited the use of Blackwall Tunnel by slow-moving vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between the hours of 5 p.m. and 6.30 p.m.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS, 1894 TO 1937.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Order No. 6871.

(Dated 29th July, 1947.)

Live Poultry (Prohibition of Movement into Scotland and Northern England) Order of 1947.

Subject:—

Prohibits, as from 6th August, 1947, the movement into Scotland and the counties of Cumberland, Durham, Northumberland and Westmorland, of live poultry, other than day-old chicks, from any other part of England or from Wales.

(Dated 1st August, 1947.)

Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 67 of 1947.

Subject:—

1. Contracts as from 8th August, 1947, the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Warndon,

Worcestershire, declared by Order No. 6870, to an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 5 miles of Warndon, Worcestershire.

2. Releases such contracted Infected Area from restrictions on 15th August, 1947.

INCOME TAX.

Whereas it is provided by the Income Tax Acts that every person who is intrusted with the payment of any dividends which are payable out of the public revenue of Northern Ireland or which are payable to any persons in the United Kingdom out of any public revenue other than that of the United Kingdom or of Northern Ireland; or who has intrusted to him any interest, dividends or other annual payments payable out of or in respect of the stocks, funds, shares or securities of any foreign or colonial company, society, adventure or concern for payment to any persons in the United Kingdom; or who has intrusted to him any annuities, pensions or other annual sums payable out of the funds of any institution in India for payment to any persons in the United Kingdom shall, within one month after being so required by notice published in the Gazette, deliver to His Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue an account in writing, giving his name and residence and a description of the dividends, interest, annuities, pensions or other annual payments or sums intrusted to him for payment; and whereas by the said Acts it is further provided that any person who neglects or refuses to deliver any such account as aforesaid shall forfeit the sum of One Hundred Pounds over and above the tax chargeable on any such dividends, interest, annuities, pensions or other annual payments or sums, notice is hereby given to all persons intrusted with the payment of any such dividends, interest, annuities, pensions or other annual payments or sums as aforesaid that the accounts of the said dividends, etc., required by the said Acts are to be delivered in writing to His Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue at Somerset House, London, W.C.2, addressed to their Secretary within the space of one month from the date hereof.
