Her Majesty being come to Washington-Hall about Eleven of the Clock, and having retired into the Court of Hands, the Nobility, and those who formed the First Part of the Proceeding, being put in Order by the Heralds, came down in Solema Proceition into Washington-Hall, where Her Majesty being leared under Her State, the Swords and Spurs were preferred to Her, and laid upon the Table at the upper end of the Hall.

Then the Dean and Probendaries of Washington having brought the Crown and other Regala, with the Bible, Challete, and Pren, they were presented feverally to Her Majesty, and shortly after were, together with the Swords and Squis, delivered to the Lords appointed to carry them.
