WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of July, 1947, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a part of the parish of East Wickham, in the country of Kent and diocese of Southwark, a separate district and new parish for ecclesiastical purposes:

"Whereas we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a separate district or new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any conse-crated church within the area as suitable to be the

crated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:

"" Constitutes (a) As from the data of the

"I. Constitution.—(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Mary the Virgin, Welling '.

"2. Archdeaconry and rural deanery.—The said district and parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Lewisham, and in the rural deanery of Woolwich.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area coloured pink on the plan hereto annexed comprising:-

All that portion of the said parish of East Wickham which is bounded on the north and on

the north-west by the parishes of The Ascension, Plumstead, and Christ Church, Shooters Hill, on the west by the parish of Saint Luke, Well Hall, Eltham, and on the south and south-east by the parish of Saint John, Welling, and on the remaining side, that is to say on the east by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint John, Welling, from the said parish of East Wickham at a point in the middle of Central Avenue, where it is crossed by the Bexley Heath line of the Southern Railway and extending thence northwards along the middle of Central Avenue to its junction with Wickham Street, and extending thence to and then northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned street to a point opposite to the south-western end of the south-eastern wall or fence of the house numbered 2, Glenmore Road and extending thence numbered 2, Glenmore Road and extending thence north-eastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the southern walls or fences of the houses numbered 2 to 8 Rosemary Road and extending thence eastwards along the last mentioned walls or fences to their along the last mentioned walls or fences to their eastern end and extending thence north-westwards along the eastern walls or fences (passing the eastern end of Rosemary Road) of the houses numbered 8 and 7 Rosemary Road to their junction with the northern walls or fences of the houses numbered 7 to 1 Rosemary Road and extending thence westwards along the last mentioned walls or fences to their junction with the eastern walls or fences of the houses numbered 14 to 140 Glenmore Road and extending thence generally north-westwards along the last mentioned walls or fences to the north-eastern end of the northwestern wall or fence of number 140 Glenmore Road and extending thence north-westwards to a Road and extending thence north-westwards to a point in the middle of Camdale Road opposite to the said north-eastern end of the last mentioned wall or fence on the boundary which divides the said parish of East Wickham from the said parish of The Ascension, Plumstead."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure:

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.
