CORONER, ENGLAND.

THE COUNTY OF KENT (CORONERS' DISTRICTS) ORDER, 1947, DATED AUGUST 13TH, 1947, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 12 OF THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5. C. 59), ALTERING THE CORONERS' DISTRICTS IN THE COUNTY OF KENT.
