TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1944.

CITY OF PLYMOUTH (STONEHOUSE) DECLARATORY ORDER, 1947.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister of Town and Country Planning in pursuance of the powers vested in him by Section 1 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, on the twenty-second day of August, 1947, made an Order declaring the land situate at Plymouth and described in the Schedule hereto, which land is shown on the map referred to in the Order, to be subject to compulsory purchase for the purpose of dealing with war damage.

A copy of the Order and of the map (and of the descriptive matter annexed thereto) have been deposited at the Town Clerk's Office, Pounds House, Peverell, Plymouth, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without payment of fee during usual office hours.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1944.

NOTICE is hereby given that The Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Portsmouth acting by the Council, in pursuance of their powers under Section 1 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, on the 24th day of June, 1947, have applied to the Minister of Town and Country Planning for an Order under the said Section declaring that the land situate at Portsmouth and described in the Schedule hereto, which land is shown on the map accompanying the application, shall be subject to compulsory purchase for the purposes of dealing with war damage, and that the application is about to be considered by the Minister.

A copy of the application and of the map referred to and of the other documents relating to the application have been deposited at the offices of the City Planning Officer, 1 Western Parade, Southsea, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without payment of fee between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon and of 3 p.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays (inclusive) and between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any objection to the application must be made in writing, stating the grounds of the objection, and addressed to the Minister of Town and Country Planning, 32, St. James's Square, London, S.W.1, before the 6th day of October 1947.

The Minister is not, in all cases, required to arrange for objections to be heard by a person

appointed by him for that purpose. It is important, therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.

Notice is also hereby given that any owner or occupier of land to which the application relates may send to the Town Clerk, City Council Chambers, 1 Clarence Parade, Southsea, a request in writing to serve him with notices under Sub Section (7) (g) and (11) of Section 1 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1944.

Such request should contain a statement of the name, postal address, and the interest in the land of the owner or occupier, and particulars sufficient to enable the local planning or highway authority to identify the extent and boundaries of the land.

THE SCHEDULE.

1. An area north of the Southern Railway main station and bounded generally on the west by Stanhope, Unicorn and Flathouse Roads, on the north by Sultan Road, Buckingham Place, Lake, Foster, Church, Fratton and Manor Roads, on the east by Shakespeare and Guildford Roads and on the south by Alver Road, Fitzroy, Common, Fyning, Northam and Bishop Streets, Railway View, Durham Street and Station Street.

2. An area south of the said Railway Station and bounded generally on the west by the line of Commercial Road and the Terraces, on the south by Southsea Terrace and the western end of Kent Road, on the east by a line roughly parallel to and east and south of Castle Road and Elm Grove, crossing the latter by Grove Road North and proceeding northwards to and then following Somers Road, and on the north by the Railway and Greatham Street.

3. The area of Portsea which lies west of the Royal Naval Barracks and Service Recreation Grounds, and north of the Southern Railway to the Harbour Station.

4. The greater part of the area of Old Portsmouth which lies north west of Clarence Barracks and Government Green.

5. An area on either side of Palmerston Road forming the greater part of the area enclosed by a line joining the following points:—

South end of Palmerston Road.

Junction of Richmond Road and Victoria Road South.

North end of Marmion Avenue.

Western end of Merton Road.

South western end of Serpentine Road.

CITY OF MANCHESTER (AREA OF EXTENSIVE WAR DAMAGE NO. 1) DECLARATORY ORDER, 1947.
