Civil Service Commission.

30th September, 1947.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

NORMAL REGULATIONS FOR RECRUITMENT TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE CLASS OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. There will be two Methods of entry: Method I and Method II. Regulations 2 and 3 relate to Method I, and Regulations 4 and 5 to Method II: the remaining Regulations relate to both Methods.

METHOD I.

2. Subjects of Examination.

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination comprising 3 compulsory subjects, namely Essay, English, and Present Day, for each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted, together with a selection from the optional subjects set out in the Appendix, which is to be construed as forming part of these Regulations. Subject to the provisions in the Appendix, candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 700 marks.

(B) A preliminary interview by a single interviewer who will supply a report for the information of the Final Interview Board referred to in C.

(C) An interview before the Final Interview Board which will award a mark out of a maximum of 300 for the candidate's record, intelligence and personal qualities.

(ii) The final order of merit will be determined by the total marks gained in the whole examination. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates, the Commissioners may determine at their discretion which to declare successful.

3. Eligibility.

(i) Candidates must (save as provided below) be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on the 1st day of August, 1948. But

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular or short-service engagement in H.M. Forces may for this purpose deduct his period of such service from his actual age;

(b) as an exceptional concession for the year 1948, candidates born on or after 2nd August, 1915, and on or before 1st August, 1924, may be admitted to the Competition for Method I only.

(ii) No specific educational qualifications are required of candidates competing under Method I; and candidates may so compete without prejudice to their rights, if any, to compete under Reconstruction Regulations. But a candidate who has already made two attempts in the Reconstruction Competition may compete in the present Competition under Method I only.

METHOD II.

4. Subjects of Examination.

(i) The examination consists of the following:

(A) A written qualifying examination consisting of two papers in English, two General Papers, and a test of General Intelligence.

(B) For candidates who pass the qualifying examination:

a series of tests of personal qualities at a residential centre, followed by an interview before the Final Selection Board.

(ii) The final order of merit will be determined by the mark awarded by the Final Selection Board out of a maximum of 300. This will take into account the candidate's record, his intelligence and personal qualities, his work in the qualifying examination, and the report on his performance at the residential centre. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners may determine at their discretion which to declare successful.

5. Eligibility.

(i) Age.—Candidates must be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on 1st August, 1948. But a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular or short-service engagement in H.M. Forces may for this purpose deduct the period of such service from his actual age.

(ii) Education.—Candidates must either (a) have completed a full course of study for an honours degree at a recognised University and obtained at least second class honours at their degree examination, or (b) be in the last year of a full course for an honours degree at a recognised University. In the latter case, they will not be declared successful unless they obtain at least second class honours in their degree examination.

(iii) A candidate who has served or is serving on a regular or short-service engagement in H.M. Forces may be admitted to compete, notwithstanding that he fails to satisfy the requirements in sub-para. (ii), if (a) he is in other respects eligible under these Regulations to compete; and (b) he is recommended to the Civil Service Commissioners by the appropriate Service Authority, as warranting consideration for appointment to the Administrative Class of the Home Civil Service by reason of his record, education, intelligence, and personal qualities.

(iv) A candidate who has already made two attempts in the Reconstruction Competition will not be eligible to compete under Method II in the present Competition.

6. Sex and marriage.

(1) Both men and women are eligible, but women will not ordinarily be appointed to posts in the Ministry of Defence, Admiralty, War Office or Air Ministry.

(2) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

7. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject, or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

8. *Health and Character.*

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

9. *Vacancies.*

The number of vacancies to be filled from the Competition as a whole, and the number to be filled by Method I and Method II respectively, will be determined by the Commissioners, but the number of vacancies to be filled from Method II will not exceed 25 per cent. of the whole.

10. *Candidates trained as Teachers.*

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g. the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

11. *Assignment.*

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

12. *Canvassing.*

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their Application Forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

13. *Fees.*

The normal fee, payable by all candidates, is £1 for each attempt, and must be sent with the Application Form. A candidate who applies to compete by both Methods at different times must send the full fee with each Application Form; but one who sends in both Application Forms together may pay a reduced fee of 30s.

14. These Regulations apply to the examination of 1948, and are liable to be modified for subsequent examinations. They are issued by the Civil Service Commissioners with the approval of the Treasury.

**NORMAL REGULATIONS FOR RECRUITMENT TO THE
SENIOR BRANCH OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.**

1. No Candidate may compete more than twice in all under these Regulations and under the Reconstruction Regulations for the Senior Branch of the Foreign Service if he is eligible to compete under both sets of Regulations.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 20½ and under 24 years of age on the 1st August, 1948.

But a candidate who has served, or is serving, on a regular or short service engagement in His Majesty's Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age.

3. Marriage.

Both men and women may compete under these Regulations; but

(a) every woman candidate must be unmarried or a widow;

(b) women will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage, but in exceptional cases they may be retained with the permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

The approval of the Secretary of State is required before a successful male candidate who is married takes up appointment.

4. Nationality.

(i) Every candidate must

(a) be a natural-born British subject; and

(b) have been born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions of parents both of whom were also born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions.

(2) No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects and who also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

5. Health and Character.

6. Examination.

(i) Candidates must either (a) have completed a full course of study for an honours degree at a recognised University, and obtained at least second class honours at their degree examination or (b) be in the last year of a full course for an honours degree at a recognised University. (ii) Candidates who are unable to satisfy the provisions of sub-paragraph (i) may qualify if they take the written examination under Method I for the Administrative Class of the Home Civil Service and reach in it a standard satisfactory to the Commissioners.

(iii) A candidate who has served, or is serving, on a regular or short service engagement in His Majesty's Forces may be admitted to compete, notwithstanding that he fails to satisfy either sub-paragraph (i) or sub-paragraph (ii) if (a) he is in other respects eligible under these Regulations to compete; and (b) he is recommended to the Civil Service Commissioners by the appropriate Service Authority as warranting consideration for appointment to the Senior Branch of the Foreign Service by reason of his record, education, intelligence, and personal qualities.

(iv) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written qualifying examination consisting of papers in English, two General Papers, and a test of General Intelligence;

(B) a qualifying oral test in a foreign language approved by the Commissioners; but the Commissioners may dispense with this in the case of a candidate who satisfies them that he possesses adequate ability to speak a modern foreign language;

(C) for candidates who pass the qualifying examination and who pass the oral test, or are exempted therefrom:

a series of tests of personal qualities at a residential centre, followed by an interview before the Final Selection Board.

(v) The final order of merit will be determined by the mark awarded by the Final Selection Board out of a maximum of 300. This will take into account the candidate's record, his intelligence and personal qualities, his work in the qualifying examination, and the report on his performance at the residential centre. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates, the Commissioners may determine at their discretion which to declare successful.

7. Candidates trained as Teachers.
