plane, after which limit of endurance forced a return to base after a flight of 26 hours 12

As the Hipper class cruiser—PRINZ EUGEN—last seen in company with the BISMARCK early on 25th May was unaccounted for, Coastal Command maintained two patrols by Sun of the Branch River from across the mouth of the Bay of Biscay from dawn during the day, and Hudsons of No. 206 Squadron carried out searches in this area from o900 till 1830, while Wellingtons of No. 221 Squadron completed the patrols across the mouth of the Bay up till 1900 hours.

Over the whole period from the locating of the two enemy ships near Bergen on 21st May until dusk on 27th May, aircraft of Coastal Command flew 69 sorties, totalling 580 hours flying, while searching for or shadowing these two ships.
