"And whereas it appears to us to be desirable to revise the existing Table of the Scales of 'Greenwich Hospital Special Pensions' awarded under the authority vested in us by Orders in Council made by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria. "We humbly recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to approve of the accompany-ing regulations being substituted for those now in force: force.

"Should Your Majesty be graciously pleased to approve, we would further most humbly recom-mend that the provisions of these Regulations should be made retrospective so far as to include certain cases, which would not be excluded by the accom-panying Table, where payments on the basis pro-posed therein have been specially sanctioned by us.
