#### RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

##### LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport, after the expiry of at least 40 days from

this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 10 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, to make Regulations for the purpose of (a) revoking the London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (No. 28) (Sevenoaks) Regulations, 1938, which instituted one-way traffic on Smith's Lane, Crockham Hill, and (b) prohibiting traffic from entering Smith's Lane at its northern end.
